

## 97TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2011 and 2012 HB3881

## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

225 ILCS 412/33

Amends the Electrologist Licensing Act. Provides that the Department of Financial and Professional Regulation may issue a license to an individual who failed to apply for licensure on or before February 22, 2006, but who otherwise meets the qualifications, provided that the individual submits a completed application for licensure as required within 90 days after the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 97th General Assembly. Effective immediately.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Electrologist Licensing Act is amended by changing Section 33 as follows:
- 6 (225 ILCS 412/33)
- 7 (Section scheduled to be repealed on January 1, 2014)
- 8 Sec. 33. Grandfather provision.
- 9 (a) For a period of 12 months after the filing of the original administrative rules adopted under this Act, the 10 Department may issue a license to any individual who, in 11 addition to meeting the requirements set forth in paragraphs 12 (1), (2), (3), and (4) of Section 30, can document employment 13 14 an electrologist and has received remuneration for practicing electrology for a period of 3 years and can show 15 16 proof of one of the following: (i) current board certification 17 by a national electrology certifying body approved by the Department; or (ii) completion of 30 continuing education units 18 19 in electrology approved by the Department.
- 20 (b) The Department may issue a license to an individual who
  21 failed to apply for licensure under subsection (a) of this
  22 Section on or before February 22, 2006 (one year after the
  23 effective date of the rules adopted under this Act), but who

- 1 otherwise meets the qualifications set forth in subsection (a)
- of this Section, provided that the individual submits a

- 6 (c) The Department may issue a license to an individual who
- 7 <u>failed to apply for licensure under subsection (a) of this</u>
- 8 Section on or before February 22, 2006 (one year after the
- 9 effective date of the rules adopted under this Act), but who
- otherwise meets the qualifications set forth in subsection (a)
- 11 of this Section, provided that the individual submits a
- 12 completed application for licensure as required within 90 days
- 13 after the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 97th
- 14 General Assembly.
