

97TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2011 and 2012 HB5223

SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

730 ILCS 5/3-14-1.5

Amends the Unified Code of Corrections. Provides that a parole agent or parole supervisor shall register his or her off-duty firearms with the agency with whom the parole agent or parole supervisor is employed (rather than with the Illinois Department of State Police).

1 AN ACT concerning corrections.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Unified Code of Corrections is amended by changing Section 3-14-1.5 as follows:
- 6 (730 ILCS 5/3-14-1.5)
- Sec. 3-14-1.5. Parole agents and parole supervisors;

 8 off-duty firearms. Subsections 24-1(a)(4) and 24-1(a)(10) and

 9 Section 24-1.6 of the Criminal Code of 1961 do not apply to

 10 parole agents and parole supervisors who meet the following

 11 conditions:
- 12 (1) The parole agent or parole supervisor must receive training in the use of firearms while off-duty conducted by the 13 14 Illinois Law Enforcement Training Standards Board and be certified as having successfully completing such training by 15 16 the Board. The Board shall determine the amount of such 17 training and the course content for such training. The parole agent or parole supervisor shall requalify for the firearms 18 19 training annually at a State range certified by the Illinois 20 Law Enforcement Training Standards Board. The expenses of such retraining shall be paid by the parole agent or parole 21 22 supervisor and moneys for such requalification shall be expended at the request of the Illinois Law Enforcement 23

- 1 Training Standards Board.
- 2 (2) The parole agent or parole supervisor shall purchase
- 3 such firearm at his or her own expense and shall register the
- 4 firearm with the <u>agency with whom the parole agent or parole</u>
- 5 supervisor is employed Illinois Department of State Police and
- 6 with any other local law enforcement agencies that require such
- 7 registration.
- 8 (3) The parole agent or parole supervisor may not carry any
- 9 Illinois Department of Corrections State issued firearm while
- off-duty. A person who violates this paragraph (3) is subject
- 11 to disciplinary action by the Illinois Department of
- 12 Corrections.
- 13 (4) Parole agents and supervisors who are discharged from
- 14 employment of the Illinois Department of Corrections shall no
- longer be considered law enforcement officials and all their
- 16 rights as law enforcement officials shall be revoked
- 17 permanently.
