SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

215 ILCS 106/26 215 ILCS 170/36 305 ILCS 5/5-1.4

Amends the Children's Health Insurance Program Act, the Covering ALL KIDS Health Insurance Act, and the Medical Assistance Article of the Illinois Public Aid Code. Removes language providing that there shall be a 2-year moratorium on eligibility expansions under the Children's Health Insurance Program, the Covering ALL KIDS Health Insurance program, and the State's medical assistance program and instead provides that the moratorium shall be in effect for either (i) a period of 2 years after January 25, 2011 (the effective date of Public Act 96-1501), or (ii) until the State expands eligibility for legal residents with incomes up to 133% of the federal poverty level as mandated by the provisions of the federal Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act of 2010, whichever is longer. Effective immediately.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Children's Health Insurance Program Act is
amended by changing Section 26 as follows:

6 (215 ILCS 106/26)

7 Sec. 26. Moratorium on eligibility expansions. Beginning on the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 96th 8 9 General Assembly, there shall be a 2-year moratorium on the expansion of eligibility through increasing 10 financial eligibility standards, or 11 through increasing income disregards, or through the creation of new programs that would 12 add new categories of eligible individuals under the medical 13 14 assistance program under the Illinois Public Aid Code in addition to those categories covered on January 1, 2011. This 15 16 moratorium shall not apply to expansions required as a federal 17 condition of State participation in the medical assistance 18 program.

19This moratorium shall be in effect either (i) for a period20of 2 years after January 25, 2011 (the effective date of Public21Act 96-1501), or (ii) until the State expands eligibility for22legal residents with incomes up to 133% of the federal poverty23level as mandated by the provisions of the federal Patient

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Protection and Affordable Care Act of 2010, whichever is longer.

Section 10. The Covering ALL KIDS Health Insurance Act is
amended by changing Section 36 as follows:

8 Sec. 36. Moratorium on eligibility expansions. Beginning on the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 96th 9 10 General Assembly, there shall be a 2-year moratorium on the 11 expansion of eligibility through increasing financial eligibility standards, or 12 through increasing income 13 disregards, or through the creation of new programs that would add new categories of eligible individuals under the medical 14 15 assistance program under the Illinois Public Aid Code in 16 addition to those categories covered on January 1, 2011. This moratorium shall not apply to expansions required as a federal 17 condition of State participation in the medical assistance 18 19 program.

20 <u>This moratorium shall be in effect either (i) for a period</u> 21 <u>of 2 years after January 25, 2011 (the effective date of Public</u> 22 <u>Act 96-1501), or (ii) until the State expands eligibility for</u> 23 <u>legal residents with incomes up to 133% of the federal poverty</u> 24 <u>level as mandated by the provisions of the federal Patient</u> HB5911

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Protection and Affordable Care Act of 2010, whichever is longer.

7 Sec. 5-1.4. Moratorium eligibility expansions. on 8 Beginning on the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 9 96th General Assembly, there shall be a 2-year moratorium on 10 the expansion of eligibility through increasing financial 11 eligibility standards, or through increasing income disregards, or through the creation of new programs which would 12 13 add new categories of eligible individuals under the medical 14 assistance program in addition to those categories covered on 15 January 1, 2011. This moratorium shall not apply to expansions 16 required as a federal condition of State participation in the 17 medical assistance program.

This moratorium shall be in effect either (i) for a period of 2 years after January 25, 2011 (the effective date of Public Act 96-1501), or (ii) until the State expands eligibility for legal residents with incomes up to 133% of the federal poverty level as mandated by the provisions of the federal Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act of 2010, whichever is longer.
