The amounts appropriated for repairs and 9 maintenance, and other capital improvements in Section 10 for 10 repairs and maintenance, roof repairs and/or replacements and 11 miscellaneous capital improvements at the Department's 12 various institutions are to include construction, reconstruction, improvements, repairs and installation of 13 capital facilities, costs of planning, supplies, materials 14 15 and all other expenses required for roof and other types of 16 repairs and maintenance, capital improvements, and purchase
- No contract shall be entered into or obligation incurred for repairs and maintenance and other capital improvements from appropriations made in Section 10 of this Article until after the purpose and amounts have been approved in writing by the Governor.
