A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 ARTICLE 1

5 ARCHITECT OF THE CAPITOL

6 Section 5. The amount of \$3,883, or so much of thereof
7 as may be necessary and remains unexpended on June 30, 2012,
8 from a reappropriation heretofore made for such purpose in
9 Section 5 of Article 1 of Public Act 97-0076, is
10 reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund to the
11 Office of the Architect of the Capitol for plans,
12 specifications, and continuation of work pursuant to the
13 report and recommendations of the architectural, structural,
14 and mechanical surveys of the State Capitol Building. This
15 is for the continuation of the rehabilitation of the Capitol
16 Building.

17 Section 10. The sum of \$548,180, or so much thereof as
18 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
19 business on June 30, 2012, from a reappropriation heretofore
20 made for such purposes in Section 10 of Article 1 of Public
21 Act 97-0076, is reappropriated from the Capital Development

1 Fund to the Office of the Architect of the Capitol for
2 remodeling, planning, relocation, permanent equipment, and
3 other related expenses, including architectural and
4 engineering fees associated with construction, for the
5 remodeling of office space and other support areas under the
6 jurisdiction of the House of Representatives and the Senate.

7 Section 15. The sum of \$45,031,178, or so much thereof
8 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
9 business on June 30, 2012, from a reappropriation heretofore
10 made for such purpose in Article 1, Section 15 of Public Act
11 97-0076, as amended, is reappropriated from the Capital
12 Development Fund to the Office of the Architect of the
13 Capitol for all costs associated with capital upgrades and
14 improvements.

15 Section 16. The following named amounts, or so much
16 thereof as may be necessary, and remain unexpended at the
17 close of business on June 30, 2012, from reappropriations
18 heretofore made for such purposes in Article 1, Section 16 of
19 Public Act 97-0076, as amended, are reappropriated from the
20 Capital Development Fund to the Office of the Architect of
21 the Capitol for the projects hereinafter enumerated:

 17 thereof as may be necessary and remain unexpended at the
 18 close of business on June 30, 2012, from reappropriations

 21 Capital Development Fund to the Office of the Architect of
 22 the Capitol for the projects hereinafter enumerated:

22 Section 20. No contract shall be entered into or
 23 obligation incurred for any expenditures from appropriations
 24 in this Article until after the purposes and amounts have

1 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital
 2 Development Fund to the Department of Agriculture for grants
 3 to soil and water conservation districts for capital
 4 projects.

5 Section 10. No contract shall be entered into or
 6 obligation incurred for any expenditures from appropriations
 7 this Article until after the purposes and amounts have been
 8 approved in writing by the Governor.

9 Total, this Article \$2,612,500

10 ARTICLE 4

11 DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE

12 Section 1. The following named amounts, or so much
 13 thereof as may be necessary, are appropriated to the
 14 Department of Agriculture for repairs, maintenance, and
 15 capital improvements including construction, reconstruction,
 16 improvement, repair and installation of capital facilities,
 17 cost of planning, supplies, materials, equipment, services
 18 and all other expenses required to complete the work:

19 Payable from Agricultural Premium Fund:

20 For various projects at the Illinois

21 State Fairgrounds1,500,000

22 For various projects at the DuQuoin

1 State Fairgrounds600,000

3 Section 5. The amount of \$2,612,500, or so much thereof
4 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Partners for
5 Conservation Projects Fund to the Department of Agriculture
6 for the Conservation Practices Cost-Share program.

DEPARTMENT OF CENTRAL MANAGEMENT SERVICES

10 Section 5. The sum of \$20,000,000, or so much thereof as
11 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital
12 Development Fund to the Department of Central Management
13 Services for the Department of Corrections for Offender
14 Tracking System conversion.

15 Section 10. The sum of \$10,000,000, or so much thereof
16 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital
17 Development Fund to the Department of Central Management
18 Services for capital costs relating to a pilot program to
19 develop centralized citizen servicing centers; including, but
20 not limited to renovation of facilities.

1 Section 15. The sum of \$19,000,000, or so much thereof
2 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital
3 Development Fund to the Department of Central Management
4 Services for the Illinois Century Network.

5
6 Section 20. The sum of \$50,000,000, or so much thereof
7 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital
8 Development Fund to the Department of Central Management
9 Services for a Healthcare/Medicaid information technology
10 system.

11 Section 25. No contract shall be entered into or
12 obligation incurred or any expenditures made from
13 appropriations in this Article until after the purposes and
14 amounts have been approved in writing by the Governor.

17 CENTRAL MANAGEMENT SERVICES

18 Section 5. The sum of \$6,387,671, or so much thereof as
19 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
20 business on June 30, 2012, from a reappropriation heretofore
21 made for such purpose in Article 3, Section 5 of Public Act

1 97-0076, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund
2 to the Department of Central Management Services for
3 Information Technology infrastructure expenses including but
4 not limited to related hardware and equipment.

5 Section 10. The amount of \$13,500,000, or so much
6 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
7 close of business on June 30, 2012, from a reappropriation
8 heretofore made for such purposes in Section 10 of Article 3
9 of Public Act 97-0076, is reappropriated from the Capital
10 Development Fund to the Department of Central Management
11 Services for infrastructure improvement, hardware and related
12 costs.

13 Section 15. The sum of \$26,000,000, or so much thereof
14 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
15 business on June 30, 2012, from a reappropriation heretofore
16 made for such purpose in Article 3, Section 15 of Public Act
17 97-0076, as amended, is reappropriated from the Capital
18 Development Fund to the Department of Central Management
19 Services for the Illinois Century Network.

20 Section 20. No contract shall be entered into or
21 obligation incurred or any expenditures made from
22 appropriations in this Article until after the purposes and

1 amounts have been approved in writing by the Governor.

4 DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

5 Section 5. The sum of \$30,000,000, or so much thereof as
6 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
7 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
8 Opportunity for a grant to Argonne National Laboratory for an
9 Energy Storage Hub.

10 Section 10. No contract shall be entered into or
11 obligation incurred or any expenditure made from any
12 appropriation herein made in this Article until after the
13 purposes and amounts have been approved in writing by the
14 Governor.

15 Total, this Article \$30,000,000

16 ARTICLE 8

17 DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

18 Section 1. The sum of \$3,000,000, or so much thereof as
19 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of

1 business on June 30, 2012, from a reappropriation heretofore
2 made for such purposes in Section 1 of Article 4 of Public
3 Act 97-0076, from the Port Development Revolving Loan Fund to
4 the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
5 grants and loans associated with the Port Development
6 Revolving Loan Program pursuant to 30 ILCS 750/9-11.

7 Section 20. The amount of \$25,000,000, or so much
8 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
9 close of business on June 30, 2012, from a reappropriation
10 heretofore made for such purposes in Section 20 of Article 4
11 of Public Act 97-0076, is reappropriated from the Build
12 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
13 Opportunity for grants associated with the redevelopment of
14 brownfield sites.

15 Section 25. The sum of \$50,000,000, or so much thereof
16 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
17 business on June 30, 2012, from a reappropriation heretofore
18 made in Article 4, Section 25 of Public Act 97-0076, is
19 reappropriated from the Coal Development Fund to the
20 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants
21 pursuant to 20 ILCS 605/605-332 - Coal Revival Program.

22 Section 30. The sum of \$1,975,000, or so much thereof as

1 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
2 business on June 30, 2012, from a reappropriation heretofore
3 made in Article 4, Section 30 of Public Act 97-0076, is
4 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the
5 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants
6 associated with the Illinois Renewable Fuels Development Act.

7 Section 35. The sum of \$13,000,000, or so much thereof
8 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
9 business on June 30, 2012, from a reappropriation heretofore
10 made in Article 4, Section 35 of Public Act 97-0076, as
11 amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
12 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a
13 grant to Argonne National Laboratory for bondable
14 infrastructure improvements to match federal and private
15 funds of equal or greater value.

16 Section 40. The amount of \$5,000,000, or so much thereof
17 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
18 business on June 30, 2012, from a reappropriation heretofore
19 made in Article 4, Section 40 of Public Act 97-0076, is
20 reappropriated from the Coal Development Fund to the
21 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for the
22 specific purposes of acquisition, development, construction,
23 reconstruction, improvement, financing, architectural and

1 technical planning and installation of capital facilities
2 consisting of buildings, structures, durable equipment, and
3 land for the purpose of capital development of coal resources
4 within the State.

5 Section 50. The amount of \$7,000,000, or so much thereof
6 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
7 business on June 30, 2012, from a reappropriation heretofore
8 made in Article 4, Section 50 of Public Act 97-0076, is
9 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the
10 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a grant
11 to Argonne National Laboratory for the Advanced Protein
12 Crystallization Facility.

13 Section 55. The amount of \$15,000,000, or so much
14 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
15 close of business on June 30, 2012, from a reappropriation
16 heretofore made in Article 4, Section 55 of Public Act 97-
17 0076, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to
18 the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a
19 grant for the Illinois Science and Technology Park.

20 Section 65. The amount of \$20,000,000, or so much
21 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
22 close of business on June 30, 2012, from a reappropriation

1 heretofore made in Article 4, Section 65 of Public Act 97-
2 0076, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to
3 the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
4 grants associated with the Illinois Renewable Fuels
5 Development Act.

6 Section 70. The amount of \$6,750,000, or so much thereof
7 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
8 business on June 30, 2012, from a reappropriation heretofore
9 made in Article 4, Section 70 of Public Act 97-0076, is
10 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the
11 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants
12 associated with the redevelopment of brownfield sites.

13 Section 75. The amount of \$17,000,000, or so much
14 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
15 close of business on June 30, 2012, from an appropriation
16 heretofore made for such purpose in Article 4, Section 75 of
17 Public Act 97-0076, as amended, is reappropriated from the
18 Coal Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and
19 Economic Opportunity for the specific purpose of acquisition,
20 development, construction, reconstruction, improvement,
21 financing, architectural and technical planning and
22 installation of capital facilities consisting of buildings,
23 structures, durable equipment, and land for the purpose of

1 capital development of coal resources within the State,
2 including but not limited, to a grant for a commercial scale,
3 low emissions project that produces electric power,
4 synthesizes natural gas or chemicals and demonstrates
5 underground storage of at least 1 million metric tons
6 annually of carbon dioxide.

7 Section 80. The sum of \$3,980,704, or so much thereof as
8 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
9 business on June 30, 2012, from a reappropriation heretofore
10 made in Article 4, Section 80 of Public Act 97-0076, as
11 amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
12 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
13 grants and loans pursuant but not limited to Article 8,
14 Article 9, or Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

15 Section 85. The sum of \$3,130,040, or so much thereof as
16 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
17 business on June 30, 2012, from a reappropriation heretofore
18 made for such purpose in Article 4, Section 85 of Public Act
19 97-0076, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
20 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
21 Opportunity for grants and loans pursuant but not limited to
22 Article 8 or Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

1 Section 90. The sum of \$2,600,251, or so much thereof as
2 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
3 business on June 30, 2012, from a reappropriation heretofore
4 made for such purpose in Article 4, Section 90 of Public Act
5 97-0076, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
6 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
7 Opportunity for grants and loans pursuant but not limited to
8 Article 8, Article 9, or Article 10 of the Build Illinois
9 Act.

10 Section 95. The sum of \$5,567,122, or so much thereof as
11 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
12 business on June 30, 2012, from a reappropriation heretofore
13 made for such purpose in Article 4, Section 95 of Public Act
14 97-0076, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
15 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
16 Opportunity for grants and loans pursuant but not limited to
17 Article 8, Article 9, or Article 10 of the Build Illinois
18 Act.

19 Section 100. The sum of \$4,524,172, or so much thereof
20 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
21 business on June 30, 2012, from a reappropriation heretofore
22 made for such purpose in Article 4, Section 100 of Public Act
23 97-0076, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build

1 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
2 Opportunity for grants and loans pursuant but not limited to
3 Article 8, Article 9, or Article 10 of the Build Illinois
4 Act.

5 Section 105. The sum of \$150,600,695, or so much thereof
6 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
7 business on June 30, 2012, from a reappropriation heretofore
8 made for such purpose in Article 4, Section 105 of Public Act
9 97-0076, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
10 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
11 Opportunity for the purpose of making grants and loans to
12 local governments for planning, engineering, acquisition,
13 construction, reconstruction, development, improvement and
14 extension of the public infrastructure, and for any other
15 purposes authorized in subsection (a) of Section 4 of the
16 Build Illinois Bond Act and for grants to State agencies for
17 such purposes.

18 Section 110. The sum of \$47,500,000, or so much thereof
19 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
20 business on June 30, 2012, from a reappropriation heretofore
21 made for such purpose in Article 4, Section 110 of Public Act
22 97-0076, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
23 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic

1 Opportunity for the purpose of fostering economic development
2 and increased employment and the well being of the citizens
3 of Illinois, and for any other purposes authorized in
4 subsection (b) of Section 4 of the Build Illinois Bond Act
5 and for grants to State agencies for such purposes.

6 Section 115. The sum of \$19,567,094, or so much thereof
7 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
8 business on June 30, 2012, from a reappropriation heretofore
9 made for such purpose in Article 4, Section 115 of Public Act
10 97-0076, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
11 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
12 Opportunity for the development and improvement of
13 educational, scientific, technical and vocational programs
14 and facilities and the expansion of health and human
15 services, and for any other purposes authorized in subsection
16 (c) of Section 4 of the Build Illinois Bond Act and for
17 grants to State agencies for such purposes.

18 Section 120. The sum of \$30,000,000, or so much thereof
19 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
20 business on June 30, 2012, from a reappropriation heretofore
21 made for such purpose in Article 4, Section 120 of Public Act
22 97-0076, as amended, is reappropriated from the Capital
23 Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic

1 Opportunity for open spaces, recreational and conservation
2 purposes and the protection of land and for deposits into the
3 Partners for Conservation Projects Fund as authorized by
4 subsection (c) of Section 3 of the General Obligation Bond
5 Act or for grants to State agencies for such purposes.

6 Section 125. The sum of \$33,199,978, or so much thereof
7 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
8 business on June 30, 2012, from a reappropriation heretofore
9 made for such purpose in Article 4, Section 125 of Public Act
10 97-0076, as amended, is reappropriated from the Capital
11 Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
12 Opportunity for grants to local governments for the
13 acquisition, financing, architectural planning, development,
14 alteration, installation, and construction of capital
15 facilities consisting of buildings, structures, durable
16 equipment, and land as authorized by subsection (1) of
17 Section 3 of the General Obligation Bond Act or for grants to
18 State agencies for such purposes.

19 Section 130. The amount of \$10,000,000, or so much
20 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
21 close of business on June 30, 2012, from a reappropriation
22 heretofore made for such purpose in Article 4, Section 130 of
23 Public Act 97-0076, is reappropriated from the Capital

1 Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
2 Opportunity for grants to local governments for the
3 acquisition, financing, architectural planning, development,
4 alteration, installation, and construction of capital
5 facilities consisting of buildings, structures, durable
6 equipment, and land as authorized by subsection (1) of
7 Section 3 of the General Obligation Bond Act or for grants to
8 State agencies for such purposes.

9 Section 135. The amount of \$24,750,000, or so much
10 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
11 close of business on June 30, 2012, from a reappropriation
12 heretofore made for such purpose in Article 4, Section 135 of
13 Public Act 97-0076, as amended, is reappropriated from the
14 Build Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and
15 Economic Opportunity for grants pursuant but not limited to
16 Article 8, Article 9, or Article 10 of the Build Illinois
17 Act.

18 Section 140. The sum of \$13,745,450, or so much thereof
19 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
20 business on June 30, 2012, from a reappropriation heretofore
21 made for such purpose in Article 4, Section 140 of Public Act
22 97-0076, as amended, is reappropriated from the Fund for
23 Illinois' Future to the Department of Commerce and Economic

1 Opportunity for grants to units of government, educational
 2 facilities and not-for-profit organizations for education and
 3 training, infrastructure improvements and other capital
 4 projects including but not limited to planning, construction,
 5 reconstruction, equipment, utilities and vehicles, and all
 6 costs associated with economic development programs,
 7 community service programs, public health programs, public
 8 safety programs, other programs and activities, and for
 9 grants to other State agencies for any capital or operating
 10 purposes.

11 Section 145. The amount of \$25,000,000, or so much
 12 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
 13 close of business on June 30, 2012, from a reappropriation
 14 heretofore made for such purpose in Article 4, Section 145 of
 15 Public Act 97-0076, as amended, is reappropriated from the
 16 Build Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and
 17 Economic Opportunity for grants to local governments for
 18 capital improvements to civic centers for the projects
 19 hereinafter enumerated:

 4 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
 5 business on June 30, 2012, from a reappropriation heretofore
 6 made for such purpose in Article 4, Section 150 of Public Act
 7 97-0076, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
 8 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
