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1 AN ACT concerning education.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing Section
21-14 as follows:

6 (105 ILCS 5/21-14) (from Ch. 122, par. 21-14)

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Sec. 21-14. Registration and renewal of certificates.

8 (a) A limited four-year certificate or a certificate issued 9 after July 1, 1955, shall be renewable at its expiration or within 60 days thereafter by the county superintendent of 10 schools having supervision and control over the school where 11 the teacher is teaching upon certified evidence of meeting the 12 requirements for renewal as required by this Act and prescribed 13 14 by the State Board of Education in consultation with the State Certification Board. 15 Teacher An elementary supervisory certificate shall not be renewed at the end of the first 16 17 four-year period covered by the certificate unless the holder thereof has filed certified evidence with the State Teacher 18 19 Certification Board that he has a master's degree or that he has earned 8 semester hours of credit in the field of 20 21 educational administration and supervision in a recognized 22 institution of higher learning. The holder shall continue to earn 8 semester hours of credit each four-year period until 23

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1 such time as he has earned a master's degree.

2 All certificates not renewed as provided in this Section or 3 registered in accordance with this Code shall lapse after a period of 6 months from the expiration of the last year of 4 5 registration. Such certificates may be immediately reinstated upon payment by the applicant to the State Board of Education 6 7 of (1) any and all back fees, including without limitation 8 registration fees, owed from the time of expiration of the 9 certificate until the date of reinstatement; and (2) a \$500 10 penalty or the demonstration of proficiency by completing 9 11 semester hours of coursework from a regionally accredited 12 institution of higher education in the content area that most 13 aligns with the educator's endorsement area or areas; provided that, until September 1, 2012, certificates that have lapsed 14 15 solely for the failure to pay a registration fee may be 16 immediately reinstated upon payment only of any and all back 17 fees, including without limitation registration fees, owed from the time of expiration of the certificate until the date 18 19 of reinstatement. Any and all back fees and penalty amounts shall be deposited by the State Board of Education into the 20 21 Teacher Certificate Fee Revolving Fund. Any certificate may be 22 voluntarily surrendered by the certificate holder. Α 23 voluntarily surrendered certificate shall be treated as a revoked certificate. 24

(b) When those teaching certificates issued before
February 15, 2000 are renewed for the first time after February

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1 15, 2000, all such teaching certificates shall be exchanged for 2 Standard Teaching Certificates as provided in subsection (c) of 3 Section 21-2. All Initial and Standard Teaching Certificates, 4 including those issued to persons who previously held teaching 5 certificates issued before February 15, 2000, shall be 6 renewable under the conditions set forth in this subsection 7 (b).

Initial Teaching Certificates are valid for 4 years of 8 9 teaching, as provided in subsection (b) of Section 21-2 of this 10 Code, and are renewable every 4 years until the person completes 4 years of teaching. If the holder of an Initial 11 12 Certificate has completed 4 years of teaching but has not 13 completed the requirements set forth in paragraph (2) of subsection (c) of Section 21-2 of this Code, then the Initial 14 15 Certificate may be reinstated for one year, during which the 16 requirements must be met. A holder of an Initial Certificate who has not completed 4 years of teaching may continuously 17 register the certificate for additional 4-year periods without 18 penalty. Initial Certificates that are not registered shall 19 lapse consistent with subsection (a) of this Section and may be 20 reinstated only in accordance with subsection (a). Standard 21 22 Teaching Certificates are renewable every 5 years as provided 23 in subsection (c) of Section 21-2 and subsection (c) of this Section. For purposes of this Section, "teaching" is defined as 24 25 employment and performance of services in an Illinois public or State-operated elementary school, secondary school, 26 or

1 cooperative or joint agreement with a governing body or board 2 of control, in a certificated teaching position, or a charter 3 school operating in compliance with the Charter Schools Law.

4 (c) In compliance with subsection (c) of Section 21-2 of 5 this Code, which provides that a Standard Teaching Certificate 6 may be renewed by the State Teacher Certification Board based 7 upon proof of continuing professional development, the State 8 Board of Education and the State Teacher Certification Board 9 shall jointly:

10 (1) establish a procedure for renewing Standard 11 Teaching Certificates, which shall include but not be 12 limited to annual timelines for the renewal process and the 13 components set forth in subsections (d) through (k) of this 14 Section;

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(2) establish the standards for certificate renewal;

(3) approve or disapprove the providers of continuing
 professional development activities;

(4) determine the maximum credit for each category of 18 19 continuing professional development activities, based upon 20 recommendations submitted by a continuing professional development activity task force, which shall consist of 6 21 22 staff members from the State Board of Education, appointed 23 by the State Superintendent of Education, and 6 teacher representatives, 3 of whom are selected by the Illinois 24 25 Education Association and 3 of whom are selected by the 26 Illinois Federation of Teachers;

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1 (5) designate the type and amount of documentation 2 required to show that continuing professional development 3 activities have been completed; and

4 (6) provide, on a timely basis to all Illinois 5 teachers, certificate holders, regional superintendents of 6 schools, school districts, and others with an interest in 7 continuing professional development, information about the 8 standards and requirements established pursuant to this 9 subsection (c).

10 (d) Any Standard Teaching Certificate held by an individual employed and performing services in an Illinois public or 11 12 State-operated elementary school, secondary school, or cooperative or joint agreement with a governing body or board 13 14 of control in a certificated teaching position or a charter 15 school in compliance with the Charter Schools Law must be 16 maintained Valid and Active through certificate renewal 17 activities specified in the certificate renewal procedure established pursuant to subsection (c) of this 18 Section, provided that a holder of a Valid and Active certificate who is 19 20 only employed on either a part-time basis or day-to-day basis 21 as а substitute teacher shall pay only the required 22 registration fee to renew his or her certificate and maintain 23 Valid and Active. All other Standard it. as Teaching Certificates held may be maintained as Valid and Exempt through 24 the registration process provided for in the certificate 25 26 renewal procedure established pursuant to subsection (c) of

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1 Section. A Valid and Exempt certificate must this be 2 immediately activated, through procedures developed jointly by Education and the 3 the State Board of State Teacher Certification Board, upon the certificate holder becoming 4 5 employed and performing services in an Illinois public or 6 State-operated elementary school, secondary school, or 7 cooperative or joint agreement with a governing body or board 8 of control in a certificated teaching position or a charter 9 school operating in compliance with the Charter Schools Law. A 10 holder of a Valid and Exempt certificate may activate his or 11 her certificate through procedures provided for in the 12 certificate renewal procedure established pursuant to subsection (c) of this Section. 13

(e) (1) A Standard Teaching Certificate that has been 14 15 maintained as Valid and Active for the 5 years of the 16 certificate's validity shall be renewed as Valid and Active 17 upon the certificate holder: (i) completing an advanced degree from an approved institution in an education-related field; 18 (ii) completing at least 8 semester hours of coursework as 19 20 described in subdivision (B) of paragraph (3) of this subsection (e); (iii) (blank); (iv) completing the National 21 22 Board for Professional Teaching Standards process as described 23 in subdivision (D) of paragraph (3) of this subsection (e); or (v) earning 120 continuing professional development units 24 ("CPDU") as described in subdivision (E) of paragraph (3) of 25 26 this subsection (e). The maximum continuing professional

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development units for each continuing professional development 1 2 activity identified in subdivisions (F) through (J) of 3 (3) of this subsection (e) shall be paragraph jointly determined by the State Board of Education and the State 4 5 Teacher Certification Board. If, however, the certificate holder has maintained the certificate as Valid and Exempt for a 6 7 portion of the 5-year period of validity, the number of 8 continuing professional development units needed to renew the 9 certificate as Valid and Active shall be proportionately 10 reduced by the amount of time the certificate was Valid and 11 Exempt. Furthermore, if a certificate holder is employed and 12 performs teaching services on a part-time basis for all or a 13 portion of the certificate's 5-year period of validity, the number of continuing professional development units needed to 14 15 renew the certificate as Valid and Active shall be reduced by 16 50% for the amount of time the certificate holder has been 17 employed and performed teaching services on a part-time basis. Part-time shall be defined as less than 50% of the school day 18 19 or school term.

Notwithstanding any other requirements to the contrary, if a Standard Teaching Certificate has been maintained as Valid and Active for the 5 years of the certificate's validity and the certificate holder has completed his or her certificate renewal plan before July 1, 2002, the certificate shall be renewed as Valid and Active.

26 (2) Beginning July 1, 2004, in order to satisfy the

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requirements for continuing professional development provided 1 2 for in subsection (c) of Section 21-2 of this Code, each Valid 3 and Active Standard Teaching Certificate holder shall complete professional development activities that address 4 the 5 certificate or those certificates that are required of his or her certificated teaching position, if the certificate holder 6 is employed and performing services in an Illinois public or 7 8 State-operated elementary school, secondary school, or 9 cooperative or joint agreement with a governing body or board 10 of control, or that certificate or those certificates most 11 closely related to his or her teaching position, if the 12 certificate holder is employed in a charter school. Except as otherwise provided in this subsection (e), the certificate 13 14 holder's activities must address purposes (A), (B), (C), or (D) 15 and must reflect purpose (E) of the following continuing 16 professional development purposes:

17 (A) Advance both the certificate holder's knowledge 18 and skills as a teacher consistent with the Illinois 19 Professional Teaching Standards and the Illinois Content 20 Area Standards in the certificate holder's areas of 21 certification, endorsement, or teaching assignment in 22 order to keep the certificate holder current in those 23 areas.

(B) Develop the certificate holder's knowledge and
skills in areas determined to be critical for all Illinois
teachers, as defined by the State Board of Education, known

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as "State priorities".

2 (C) Address the knowledge, skills, and goals of the 3 certificate holder's local school improvement plan, if the 4 teacher is employed in an Illinois public or State-operated 5 elementary school, secondary school, or cooperative or 6 joint agreement with a governing body or board of control.

7 (D) Expand the certificate holder's knowledge and 8 skills in an additional teaching field or toward the 9 acquisition of another teaching certificate, endorsement, 10 or relevant education degree.

11 (E) Address the needs of serving students with 12 disabilities, including adapting and modifying the general 13 curriculum related to the Illinois Learning Standards to meet the needs of students with disabilities and serving 14 such students in the least restrictive environment. 15 16 Teachers who hold certificates endorsed for special 17 education must devote at least 50% of their continuing 18 professional development activities to this purpose. 19 Teachers holding other certificates must devote at least 20 20% of their activities to this purpose.

20 (E) completion of 120 continuing professional development units that satisfy the continuing professional 21 22 development purposes set forth in paragraph (2) of this 23 subsection (e) and may include without limitation the activities identified in subdivisions (F) through (J) of 24 25 this paragraph (3);

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(F) collaboration and partnership activities related

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1 to improving the teacher's knowledge and skills as a 2 teacher, including the following:

(i) participating on collaborative planning and professional improvement teams and committees;

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(ii) peer review and coaching;

6 (iii) mentoring in a formal mentoring program, 7 including service as a consulting teacher 8 participating in a remediation process formulated 9 under Section 24A-5 of this Code;

10 (iv) participating in site-based management or 11 decision making teams, relevant committees, boards, or 12 task forces directly related to school improvement 13 plans;

14 (v) coordinating community resources in schools,
15 if the project is a specific goal of the school
16 improvement plan;

(vi) facilitating parent education programs for a school, school district, or regional office of education directly related to student achievement or school improvement plans;

(vii) participating in business, school, or
 community partnerships directly related to student
 achievement or school improvement plans; or

(viii) supervising a student teacher or teacher
 education candidate in clinical supervision, provided
 that the supervision may only be counted once during

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the course of 5 years;

2 (G) college or university coursework related to 3 improving the teacher's knowledge and skills as a teacher 4 as follows:

(i) completing undergraduate or graduate credit 5 earned from a regionally accredited institution in 6 7 coursework relevant to the certificate area being including coursework that incorporates 8 renewed, 9 induction activities and development of a portfolio of 10 both student and teacher work that provides experience 11 in reflective practices, provided the coursework meets 12 Illinois Professional Teaching Standards or Illinois 13 Content Area Standards and supports the essential characteristics of quality professional development; 14 15 or

16 (ii) teaching college or university courses in 17 areas relevant to the certificate area being renewed, 18 provided that the teaching may only be counted once 19 during the course of 5 years;

20 (H) conferences, workshops, institutes, seminars, and 21 symposiums related to improving the teacher's knowledge 22 and skills as a teacher, subject to disapproval of the 23 activity or event by the State Teacher Certification Board 24 acting jointly with the State Board of Education, including 25 the following:

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(i) completing non-university credit directly

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related to student achievement, school improvement 1 2 plans, or State priorities;

3 (ii) participating in or presenting at workshops, seminars, conferences, institutes, and symposiums;

5 (iii) training as external reviewers for Quality 6 Assurance;

7 (iv) training as reviewers of university teacher 8 preparation programs; or

9 (v) participating in or presenting at in-service 10 training programs on suicide prevention or on sexual 11 abuse and assault awareness and prevention.

12 A teacher, however, may not receive credit for conferences, 13 workshops, institutes, seminars, or symposiums that are 14 designed for entertainment, promotional, or commercial 15 purposes or that are solely inspirational or motivational. 16 The State Superintendent of Education and regional 17 superintendents of schools are authorized to review the activities and events provided or to be provided under this 18 19 subdivision (H) and to investigate complaints regarding 20 those activities and events, and either the State Superintendent of Education or a regional superintendent 21 22 schools may recommend that the State Teacher of 23 Certification Board and the State Board of Education jointly disapprove those activities and events considered 24 25 to be inconsistent with this subdivision (H);

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(I) other educational experiences related to improving

the teacher's knowledge and skills as a teacher, including the following:

3 (i) participating in action research and inquiry

9 (4) A person must complete the requirements of this 10 subsection (e) before the expiration of his or her Standard 11 Teaching Certificate and must submit assurance to the regional 12 superintendent of schools or, if applicable, а local 13 professional development committee authorized by the regional superintendent to submit recommendations to him or her for this 14 15 purpose. The statement of assurance shall contain a list of the 16 activities completed, the provider offering each activity, the 17 number of credits earned for each activity, and the purposes to which each activity is attributed. (f) Notwithstanding any other provisions of this Code, a 3 school district is authorized to enter into an agreement with 4 5 the exclusive bargaining representative, if any, to form a 6 local professional development committee (LPDC). The 7 membership and terms of members of the LPDC may be determined 8 by the agreement. 9 (q) (1) Each regional superintendent of schools shall 10 review and concur or nonconcur with each recommendation for 11 renewal or nonrenewal of a Standard Teaching Certificate he or 12 she receives from a local professional development committee, if any, or, if a certificate holder appeals the recommendation 13 14 to the regional professional development review committee, the 15 recommendation for renewal or nonrenewal he or she receives 16 from a regional professional development review committee and, 17 within 14 days of receipt of the recommendation, shall provide the State Teacher Certification Board with verification of the 18 19 following, if applicable:

20 (A) the certificate holder has satisfactorily 21 completed professional development and continuing 22 education activities set forth in paragraph (3) of 23 subsection (e) of this Section:

(B) the certificate holder has submitted the statement
of assurance required under paragraph (4) of subsection (e)
of this Section, and this statement has been attached to

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1 the application for renewal;

2 (C) the local professional development committee, if 3 any, has recommended the renewal of the certificate 4 holder's Standard Teaching Certificate and forwarded the 5 recommendation to the regional superintendent of schools;

6 (D) the certificate holder has appealed his or her 7 local professional development committee's recommendation 8 of nonrenewal, if any, to the regional professional 9 development review committee and the result of that appeal;

10 (E) the regional superintendent of schools has 11 concurred or nonconcurred with the local professional 12 committee's development or regional professional development review committee's recommendation, if any, to 13 renew or nonrenew the certificate holder's 14 Standard 15 Teaching Certificate and made a recommendation to that 16 effect; and

17 (F) the established registration fee for the Standard18 Teaching Certificate has been paid.

19 If the notice required by this subsection (g) includes a 20 recommendation of certificate nonrenewal, then, at the same 21 time the regional superintendent of schools provides the State 22 Teacher Certification Board with the notice, he or she shall 23 also notify the certificate holder in writing, by certified 24 mail, return receipt requested, that this notice has been 25 provided to the State Teacher Certification Board.

26 (2) Each certificate holder shall have the right to appeal

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1 his professional development committee's or her local 2 recommendation of nonrenewal, if any, to the regional 3 professional development review committee, within 14 days of receipt of notice that the recommendation has been sent to the 4 5 regional superintendent of schools. Each regional 6 shall superintendent of schools establish а regional professional development review committee or committees for 7 8 the purpose of advising the regional superintendent of schools, 9 upon request, and handling certificate holder appeals. This 10 committee shall consist of at least 4 classroom teachers, one 11 non-administrative certificated educational employee, 2 12 administrators, and one at-large member who shall be either (i) 13 a parent, (ii) a member of the business community, (iii) a 14 community member, or (iv) an administrator, with preference 15 given to an individual chosen from among those persons listed 16 in items (i), (ii), and (iii) in order to secure representation 17 of an interest not already represented on the committee. The 18 non-administrative certificated educational teacher and employee members of the review committee shall be selected by 19 20 their exclusive representative, if any, and the administrators and at-large member shall be selected by the 21 regional 22 superintendent of schools. A regional superintendent of 23 schools may add additional members to the committee, provided that the same proportion of teachers to administrators and 24 25 at-large members on the committee is maintained. Any additional 26 and non-administrative certificated educational teacher

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shall be selected by their exclusive 1 employee members 2 representative, if any. Vacancies in positions on a regional 3 professional development review committee shall be filled in the same manner as the original selections. Committee members 4 5 shall serve staggered 3-year terms. All individuals selected to serve on regional professional development review committees 6 must be known to demonstrate the best practices in teaching or 7 8 their respective field of practice.

9 (h) (1) The State Teacher Certification Board shall review 10 the regional superintendent of schools' recommendations to 11 renew or nonrenew Standard Teaching Certificates and notify 12 certificate holders in writing whether their certificates have 13 been renewed or nonrenewed within 90 days of receipt of the recommendations, unless a certificate holder has appealed a 14 15 regional superintendent of schools' recommendation of 16 nonrenewal, as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection 17 (h). The State Teacher Certification Board shall verify that the certificate holder has met the renewal criteria set forth 18 19 in paragraph (1) of subsection (g) of this Section.

20 (2) Each certificate holder shall have the right to appeal superintendent of school's recommendation to 21 regional а 22 nonrenew his or her Standard Teaching Certificate to the State 23 Teacher Certification Board, within 14 days of receipt of notice that the decision has been sent to the State Teacher 24 25 Certification Board, which shall hold an appeal hearing within 26 60 days of receipt of the appeal. When such an appeal is taken,

the certificate holder's Standard Teaching Certificate shall 1 2 continue to be valid until the appeal is finally determined. The State Teacher Certification Board shall review the regional 3 superintendent of school's recommendation, the 4 regional 5 professional development review committee's recommendation, if local professional development committee's 6 anv, and the 7 recommendation, if any, and all relevant documentation to 8 verify whether the certificate holder has met the renewal 9 criteria set forth in paragraph (1) of subsection (q) of this 10 Section. The State Teacher Certification Board may request that 11 the certificate holder appear before it. All actions taken by 12 the State Teacher Certification Board shall require a quorum and be by a simple majority of those present and voting. A 13 record of all votes shall be maintained. The State Teacher 14 Certification Board shall notify the certificate holder in 15 16 writing, within 7 days of completing the review, whether his or 17 Standard Teaching Certificate has been renewed or her nonrenewed, provided that if the State Teacher Certification 18 19 Board determines to nonrenew a certificate, the written notice 20 provided to the certificate holder shall be by certified mail, 21 return receipt requested. All certificate renewal or 22 nonrenewal decisions of the State Teacher Certification Board 23 are final and subject to administrative review.

(i) Holders of Master Teaching Certificates shall meet the
 same requirements and follow the same procedures as holders of
 Standard Teaching Certificates, except that their renewal

cycle shall be as set forth in subsection (d) of Section 21-2
 of this Code and their renewal requirements shall be subject to
 paragraph (8) of subsection (c) of Section 21-2 of this Code.

These certificate holders shall follow the 18 same renewal criteria and procedures as all other Standard and 19 20 Master Teaching Certificate holders, except that their 21 continuing professional development activities need not 22 reflect or address the knowledge, skills, and goals of a local 23 school improvement plan.

8 Section 10. The Critical Health Problems and Comprehensive 9 Health Education Act is amended by changing Section 3 as 10 follows:

11 (105 ILCS 110/3)

12 Sec. 3. Comprehensive Health Education Program. The 13 program established under this Act shall include, but not be 14 limited to, the following major educational areas as a basis 15 for curricula in all elementary and secondary schools in this State: human ecology and health, human growth and development, 16 the emotional, psychological, physiological, hygienic and 17 social responsibilities of family life, including sexual 18 abstinence until marriage, prevention and control of disease, 19 20 including instruction in grades 6 through 12 on the prevention, 21 transmission and spread of AIDS, age-appropriate sexual abuse and assault awareness and prevention education in grades 22 23 pre-kindergarten through 12 sexual assault awareness in 24 secondary schools, public and environmental health, consumer

health, safety education and disaster survival, mental health 1 2 and illness, personal health habits, alcohol, drug use, and 3 abuse including the medical and legal ramifications of alcohol, and tobacco use, abuse during pregnancy, 4 druq, sexual 5 abstinence until marriage, tobacco, nutrition, and dental health. The program shall also provide course material and 6 7 instruction to advise pupils of the Abandoned Newborn Infant 8 Protection Act. The program shall include information about 9 cancer, including without limitation types of cancer, signs and 10 symptoms, risk factors, the importance of early prevention and 11 detection. and information on where to qo for help. 12 Notwithstanding the above educational areas, the following areas may also be included as a basis for curricula in all 13 14 elementary and secondary schools in this State: basic first aid 15 (including, but not limited to, cardiopulmonary resuscitation 16 and the Heimlich maneuver), heart disease, diabetes, stroke, 17 the prevention of child abuse, neglect, and suicide, and teen dating violence in grades 8 through 12. 18

19 The school board of each public elementary and secondary 20 school in the State shall encourage all teachers and other school personnel to acquire, develop, and maintain the 21 22 knowledge and skills necessary to properly administer 23 life-saving techniques, including without limitation the 24 Heimlich maneuver and rescue breathing. certifying organization. A school board may use the services of 1 2 non-governmental entities whose personnel have expertise in life-saving techniques to instruct teachers and other school 3 personnel in these techniques. Each school board is encouraged 4 5 to have in its employ, or on its volunteer staff, at least one person who is certified, by the American Red Cross or by 6 7 qualified certifying agency, qualified another as to 8 administer first aid and cardiopulmonary resuscitation. In 9 addition, each school board is authorized to allocate 10 appropriate portions of its institute or inservice days to 11 conduct training programs for teachers and other school 12 personnel who have expressed an interest in becoming qualified 13 administer emergency first aid or cardiopulmonary to 14 resuscitation. School boards are urged to encourage their 15 teachers and other school personnel who coach school athletic and other extracurricular school activities 16 to programs 17 acquire, develop, and maintain the knowledge and skills necessary to properly administer first aid and cardiopulmonary 18 resuscitation in accordance with standards and requirements 19 20 established by the American Red Cross or another qualified 21 certifying agency. Subject to appropriation, the State Board of 22 Education shall establish and administer a matching grant 23 program to pay for half of the cost that a school district 24 incurs in training those teachers and other school personnel 25 who express an interest in becoming qualified to administer 26 cardiopulmonary resuscitation (which training must be in

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accordance with standards of the American Red Cross, 1 the American Heart Association, or another nationally recognized 2 certifying organization) or in learning how to use an automated 3 external defibrillator. A school district that applies for a 4 5 grant must demonstrate that it has funds to pay half of the cost of the training for which matching grant money is sought. 6 7 The State Board of Education shall award the grants on a 8 first-come, first-serve basis.

9 No pupil shall be required to take or participate in any 10 class or course on AIDS or family life instruction if his 11 parent or guardian submits written objection thereto, and 12 refusal to take or participate in the course or program shall 13 not be reason for suspension or expulsion of the pupil.

14 Curricula developed under programs established in 15 accordance with this Act in the major educational area of 16 alcohol and drug use and abuse shall include classroom 17 instruction in grades 5 through 12. The instruction, which shall include matters relating to both the physical and legal 18 effects and ramifications of drug and substance abuse, shall be 19 20 integrated into existing curricula; and the State Board of Education shall develop and make available to all elementary 21 22 and secondary schools in this State instructional materials and 23 quidelines which will assist the schools in incorporating the 24 instruction into their existing curricula. In addition, school 25 districts may offer, as part of existing curricula during the 26 school day or as part of an after school program, support

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services and instruction for pupils or pupils whose parent,
 parents, or guardians are chemically dependent.
