Introduced 1/27/2011, by Sen. Martin A. Sandoval

SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

from Ch. 122, par. 106-4

Amends the Public Community College Act and various Acts relating to the governance of public universities in Illinois. Provides that the tuition and fee rates for students for the 2011-2012 and 2012-2013 academic years must not be more than the tuition and fees rates in effect for the 2010-2011 academic year. Effective immediately.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The University of Illinois Act is amended by changing Section 25 as follows:

Sec. 10-120. Limitation on tuition and fee increase.

- 2 Education Student Assistance Act, shall not be included in any
- 3 calculation of community college tuition and fee rates for the
- 4 purpose of this Section.
