1 AN ACT concerning education.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Board of Higher Education Act is amended by
changing Section 9.16 as follows:

6 (110 ILCS 205/9.16) (from Ch. 144, par. 189.16)

7 Sec. 9.16. Underrepresentation of certain groups in higher 8 education. To require public institutions of higher education 9 to develop and implement methods and strategies to increase the participation of minorities, women and handicapped individuals 10 who are traditionally underrepresented in education programs 11 and activities. For the purpose of this Section, minorities 12 shall mean persons who are citizens of the United States or 13 14 lawful permanent resident aliens of the United States and who are: (a) Black (a person having origins in any of the black 15 16 racial groups in Africa); (b) Hispanic (a person of Spanish or 17 Portuguese culture with origins in Mexico, South or Central America, or the Caribbean, regardless of race); (c) Asian 18 19 American (a person having origins in any of the original people 20 of the Far East, Southeast Asia, the Indian Subcontinent or the Pacific Islands); or (d) American Indian or Alaskan Native (a 21 22 person having origins in any of the original people of North America). 23

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The Board shall adopt any rules necessary to administer
 this Section. The Board shall also do the following:

3 <u>(a)</u> require all public institutions of higher education to 4 develop and submit plans for the implementation of this 5 Section;

6 <u>(b)</u> conduct periodic review of public institutions of 7 higher education to determine compliance with this Section; and 8 if the Board finds that a public institution of higher 9 education is not in compliance with this Section, it shall 10 notify the institution of steps to take to attain compliance;

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(c) provide advice and counsel pursuant to this Section;

12 (d) conduct studies of the effectiveness of methods and 13 strategies designed to increase participation of students in 14 education programs and activities in which minorities, women 15 and handicapped individuals are traditionallv 16 underrepresented, and monitor the success of students in such 17 education programs and activities;

(e) encourage minority student recruitment and retention 18 19 in colleges and universities. In implementing this paragraph, the Board shall undertake but need not be limited to the 20 21 following: the establishment of guidelines and plans for public 22 institutions of higher education for minority student 23 recruitment and retention, the review and monitoring of minority student programs implemented at public institutions 24 25 of higher education to determine their compliance with any quidelines and plans so established, the determination of the 26

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effectiveness and funding requirements of minority student 1 2 programs at public institutions of higher education, the 3 dissemination of successful programs as models, and the encouragement of cooperative partnerships between community 4 5 colleges and local school attendance centers which are experiencing difficulties in enrolling minority students in 6 7 four-year colleges and universities;

8 <u>(e-5) require all public institutions of higher education</u> 9 <u>to track the status of those students who are the first in</u> 10 <u>their family to attend an institution of higher education;</u>

11 <u>(f)</u> mandate all public institutions of higher education to 12 submit data and information essential to determine compliance 13 with this Section. The Board shall prescribe the format and the 14 date for submission of this data and any other education equity 15 data; and

16 report to the General Assembly and the Governor (q) 17 annually with a description of the plans submitted by each public institution of higher education for implementation of 18 this Section, including financial data relating to the most 19 20 recent fiscal year expenditures for specific minority programs, the effectiveness of such plans and programs and the 21 22 effectiveness of the methods and strategies developed by the 23 Board in meeting the purposes of this Section, the degree of compliance with this Section by each public institution of 24 25 higher education as determined by the Board pursuant to its 26 periodic review responsibilities, and the findings made by the SB0122 Engrossed - 4 - LRB097 06223 NHT 46298 b

1 Board in conducting its studies and monitoring student success 2 as required by paragraph d) of this Section. With respect to each public institution of higher education such report also 3 4 shall include, but need not be limited to, information with minority program 5 respect to each institution's budget 6 minority student admission, retention allocations; and 7 graduation statistics; number of financial assistance awards 8 to undergraduate and graduate minority students; and minority 9 faculty representation; and the status of those students who are the first in their family to attend an institution of 10 11 higher education. This paragraph shall not be construed to 12 prohibit the Board from making, preparing or issuing additional 13 surveys or studies with respect to minority education in Illinois. 14
