SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

30 ILCS 605/7.3

from Ch. 127, par. 133b10.3

Amends the State Property Control Act. Provides that all but one airplane and one helicopter owned by the State and not designated for emergency use are surplus property and must be sold by a competitive sealed bid method (now, a transferable airplane may be disposed of only if (i) it is no longer needed, (ii) it will not be used as a trade-in, and (iii) a public university or college offering aviation-related instruction or training has not listed its need for an airplane). Requires that the sale proceeds be deposited into the General Revenue Fund. Effective immediately.

AN ACT concerning government.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The State Property Control Act is amended by 5 changing Section 7.3 as follows:

6 (30 ILCS 605/7.3) (from Ch. 127, par. 133b10.3)

7 Sec. 7.3. The Administrator shall have charge of all 8 transferable property and shall have authority to take 9 possession and control of such property in order to transfer or 10 assign any such property to any other State agency that has 11 need or use for such property or to dispose of said property in 12 accordance with Section 7 of this Act.

Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, 13 14 all but one airplane and one helicopter owned by the State, as selected by the Administrator and not designated for emergency 15 16 use under a plan developed pursuant to Section 3.120 of the 17 Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Systems Act, are deemed surplus and shall be sold by the Administrator as soon as 18 possible after the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 19 20 97th General Assembly using a competitive sealed bid method of 21 sale. Proceeds from the sale of those airplanes and helicopters 22 shall be deposited into the General Revenue Fund.

23 The Administrator may not dispose of a transferable

airplane by sale until he or she determines that (i) the agency
no longer has a need for the airplane, (ii) the airplane will
not be used as a trade-in on another aircraft, and (iii) no
public university or college in Illinois that offers courses in
aviation, flight training, or other subjects involving
knowledge of the workings of an airplane has listed the need
for an airplane as provided in this Section.

8 Responsible officers shall periodically report all 9 transferable property at locations under their jurisdictions to the Administrator. The Administrator shall review such 10 11 reports and arrange for physical examination of said property 12 if necessary to determine if said items of transferable property should be transferred to another State agency, 13 transferred to a central warehouse, or disposed of. The 14 15 Administrator shall advise responsible officers of the results 16 of these reviews as necessary.

17 The staff under the jurisdiction of the Administrator shall review as necessary State agencies' inventories for potential 18 items of transferable property. If in the opinion of the 19 staff, any property appears 20 Administrator's to be transferable, the Administrator shall notify the responsible 21 22 officer of his determination. The executive head of the agency 23 holding the property in question may appeal the determination in writing to the Administrator. 24

The Administrator will review the determination in accordance with rules and procedures established pursuant to SB1569 - 3 - LRB097 08562 PJG 48689 b

1 Section 5 of this Act.

The Administrator shall maintain lists of transferable 2 3 property and of State agency needs for such property and will transfer where appropriate listed transferable property to 4 5 agencies listing their needs for such property as detailed by 6 their responsible officers. The Administrator must give 7 priority for transfer of an airplane, that is not to be used as a trade in, to a public university or college in Illinois that 8 9 offers courses in aviation, flight training, or other subjects 10 involving knowledge of the workings of an airplane and that has 11 listed the need for an airplane.
