- 4 <u>Sec. 14. Advisory committee.</u>
- 5 <u>(a) No later than December 31, 2011, the county board</u> 6 chairman in every county with a population of less than
- 7 <u>3,000,000</u>, or the township supervisor of a township located in
- 8 <u>a county with a population of 3,000,000 or more, shall appoint</u>
- 9 <u>a volunteer 7 member mental health advisory committee composed</u>
- of members of the general public, if no community mental health
- 11 board has been established in the county or township as
- 12 provided under Section 3a of this Act. This subsection shall
- 13 <u>not apply to townships that currently provide mental health</u>
- services.
- 15 (b) The mental health advisory committee shall identify and
- 16 assess current mental health services in its respective
- jurisdiction, monitor any expansion or contraction of such
- 18 services, and, if deemed necessary, provide a report to the
- 19 <u>county or township board with recommendations for additional</u>
- 20 services.
- 21 (c) The mental health advisory committee shall have no
- 22 taxing authority.
