**SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:**

105 ILCS 5/14-8.02d

Amends the Children with Disabilities Article of the School Code. Provides that the due process hearing data provided by the State Board of Education for the Annual State Report on Special Education Performance must be submitted to the School Bullying Prevention Task Force. Effective immediately.

**A BILL FOR**

1 AN ACT concerning education.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,**  
3 **represented in the General Assembly:**

4 Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing Section  
5 14-8.02d as follows:

6 (105 ILCS 5/14-8.02d)

7 Sec. 14-8.02d. Evaluation of due process hearing system.  
8 The State Board of Education shall monitor, review, and  
9 evaluate the impartial due process hearing system on a regular  
10 basis by a process that includes a review of written decisions  
11 and evaluations by participants in impartial due process  
12 hearings and their representatives. In conjunction with the  
13 Annual State Report on Special Education Performance, the State  
14 Board of Education shall submit data on the performance of the  
15 due process hearing system, including data on timeliness of  
16 hearings and an analysis of the issues and disability  
17 categories underlying hearing requests during the period  
18 covered by the Annual State Report. The data provided for the  
19 Annual State Report must be submitted to the members of the  
20 State Board of Education, the State Superintendent of  
21 Education, the Advisory Council on Education of Children with  
22 Disabilities, the School Bullying Prevention Task Force  
23 created under Section 27-23.9 of this Code, and the Screening

1 Committee established under Section 14-8.02c of this Code and  
2 must be made available to the public.
