1 AN ACT concerning transportation.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by changing
- 5 Sections 11-605.1 and 12-610.1 as follows:
- 6 (625 ILCS 5/11-605.1)

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- Sec. 11-605.1. Special limit while traveling through a highway construction or maintenance speed zone.
- 9 (a) A person may not operate a motor vehicle in a 10 construction or maintenance speed zone at a speed in excess of 11 the posted speed limit.
- 12 (b) Nothing in this Chapter prohibits the use of electronic speed-detecting devices within 500 feet of signs within a 13 14 construction or maintenance speed zone indicating the zone, as defined in this Section, nor shall evidence obtained by use of 15 those devices be inadmissible in any prosecution for speeding, 16 17 provided the use of the device shall apply only to the enforcement of the speed limit in the construction or 18 19 maintenance speed zone.
 - (c) As used in this Section, a "construction or maintenance speed zone" is an area in which the Department, Toll Highway Authority, or local agency has posted signage advising drivers that a construction or maintenance speed zone is being

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approached, or in which the Department, Authority, or local agency has posted a <u>lower speed limit with a highway</u> construction or maintenance speed zone special speed limit sign after determining determined that the preexisting established speed limit through a highway construction or maintenance project is greater than is reasonable or safe with respect to the conditions expected to exist in the construction or maintenance speed zone and has posted a lower speed limit with a highway construction or maintenance speed zone special speed limit sign.

If it is determined that the preexisting established speed limit is safe with respect to the conditions expected to exist in the construction or maintenance speed zone, additional speed limit signs which conform to the requirements of this subsection (c) shall be posted.

Highway construction or maintenance speed zone special speed limit signs shall be of a design approved by the Department. The signs must give proper due warning that a construction or maintenance speed zone is being approached and must indicate the maximum speed limit in effect. The signs also must state the amount of the minimum fine for a violation.

- (d) A first violation of this Section is a petty offense with a minimum fine of \$250. A second or subsequent violation of this Section is a petty offense with a minimum fine of \$750.
- (e) If a fine for a violation of this Section is \$250 or greater, the person who violated this Section shall be charged

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- (e-5) The Department of State Police and the local county police department have concurrent jurisdiction over any violation of this Section that occurs on an interstate highway.
- (f) The Transportation Safety Highway Hire-back Fund, which was created by Public Act 92-619, shall continue to be a special fund in the State treasury. Subject to appropriation by the General Assembly and approval by the Secretary, the Secretary of Transportation shall use all moneys in the Transportation Safety Highway Hire-back Fund to hire off-duty Department of State Police officers to monitor construction or maintenance zones.

- 1 (f-5) Each county shall create a Transportation Safety
 2 Highway Hire-back Fund. The county shall use all moneys in its
 3 Transportation Safety Highway Hire-back Fund to hire off-duty
 4 county police officers to monitor construction or maintenance
 5 zones in that county on highways other than interstate
 6 highways.
- 7 (g) For a second or subsequent violation of this Section 8 within 2 years of the date of the previous violation, the 9 Secretary of State shall suspend the driver's license of the 10 violator for a period of 90 days.

- Sec. 12-610.1. Wireless telephones.
- 14 (a) As used in this Section, "wireless telephone" means a
 15 device that is capable of transmitting or receiving telephonic
 16 communications without a wire connecting the device to the
 17 telephone network.
- 18 (b) A person under the age of 19 years who holds an instruction permit issued under Section 6-105 or 6-107.1, or a 20 person under the age of 19 years who holds a graduated license 21 issued under Section 6-107, may not drive a vehicle on a 22 roadway while using a wireless phone.
- 23 (c) This Section does not apply to a person under the age 24 of 19 years using a wireless telephone for emergency purposes, 25 including, but not limited to, an emergency call to a law

- enforcement agency, health care provider, fire department, or other emergency services agency or entity.
 - (d) If a graduated driver's license holder over the age of 18 committed an offense against traffic regulations governing the movement of vehicles or any violation of Section 6-107 or Section 12-603.1 of this Code in the 6 months prior to the graduated driver's license holder's 18th birthday, and was subsequently convicted of the violation, the provisions of paragraph (b) shall continue to apply until such time as a period of 6 consecutive months has elapsed without an additional violation and subsequent conviction of an offense against traffic regulations governing the movement of vehicles or any violation of Section 6-107 or Section 12-603.1 of this Code.
 - (e) A person, regardless of age, may not use a wireless telephone at any time while operating a motor vehicle on a roadway in a school speed zone established under Section 11-605, or on a highway in a construction or maintenance speed zone established under Section 11-605.1. This subsection (e) does not apply to (i) a person engaged in a highway construction or maintenance project for which a construction or maintenance speed zone has been established under Section 11-605.1, (ii) a person using a wireless telephone for emergency purposes, including, but not limited to, law enforcement agency, health care provider, fire department, or other emergency services agency or entity, (iii) a law

- 1 enforcement officer or operator of an emergency vehicle when
- performing the officer's or operator's official duties, or (iv) 2
- 3 to a person using a wireless telephone in voice-operated mode,
- which may include the use of a headset, or (v) to a person 4
- 5 using a wireless telephone by pressing a single button to
- 6 initiate or terminate a voice communication. voice activated
- 7 mode.
