

## 97TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2011 and 2012 SB3487

## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

105 ILCS 5/29-6.3 625 ILCS 5/11-1414.1

from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 11-1414.1

Amends the School Code and the Illinois Vehicle Code. Provides that a multi-function school activity bus (MFSAB) may be used to transport students for any curriculum-related activity except for transportation on regular bus routes from home to school or from school to home. Provides that a MFSAB authorized to transport students under the new provisions must be operated by a holder of a school bus driver permit and is subject to certain provisions concerning contractual student transfer arrangements, contracts requiring school bus driver permits, liability insurance, and safety testing. Effective immediately.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- 4 Section 5.. The School Code is amended by changing Section
- 5 29-6.3 as follows:
- 6 (105 ILCS 5/29-6.3)
- 7 Sec. 29-6.3. Transportation to and from specified
- 8 interscholastic or school-sponsored activities.
- 9 (a) Any school district transporting students in grade
- 10 12 or below for an interscholastic, interscholastic athletic,
- or school-sponsored, noncurriculum-related activity that (i)
- 12 does not require student participation as part of the
- educational services of the district and (ii) is not associated
- 14 with the students' regular class-for-credit schedule or
- 15 required 5 clock hours of instruction shall transport the
- 16 students only in a school bus, a vehicle manufactured to
- 17 transport not more than 10 persons, including the driver, or a
- 18 multifunction school-activity bus manufactured to transport
- 19 not more than 15 persons, including the driver.
- 20 <u>(a-5)</u> A student may be transported in a multi-function
- 21 school activity bus (MFSAB) as defined in Section 1-148.3a-5 of
- 22 <u>this Code for any curriculum-related activity except for</u>

- 8 (b) Any school district furnishing transportation for 9 students under the authority of this Section shall insure 10 against any loss or liability of the district resulting from 11 the maintenance, operation, or use of the vehicle.
- 12 (c) Vehicles used to transport students under this Section 13 may claim a depreciation allowance of 20% over 5 years as 14 provided in Section 29-5 of this Code.

- Section 10. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by changing Section 11-1414.1 as follows:
- 18 (625 ILCS 5/11-1414.1) (from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 11-1414.1)
- 19 Sec. 11-1414.1. School transportation of students.
- 20 (a) Every student enrolled in grade 12 or below in any
  21 entity listed in subsection (a) of Section 1-182 of this Code
  22 must be transported in a school bus or a vehicle described in
  23 subdivision (1) or (2) of subsection (b) of Section 1-182 of
  24 this Code for any curriculum-related school activity, except a

3	any curriculum-related activity except for transportation on
4	regular bus routes from home to school or from school to home,
5	subject to the following conditions:

- (i) A MFSAB may not be used to transport students under this Section unless the driver holds a valid school bus driver permit.
  - (ii) The use of a MFSAB under this Section is subject to the requirements of Sections 6-106.11, 6-106.12, 12-707.01, 13-101, and 13-109 of this Code.

"Curriculum-related school activity" as used in this subsection (a) includes transportation from home to school or from school to home, tripper or shuttle service between school attendance centers, transportation to a vocational or career center or other trade-skill development site or a regional safe school or other school-sponsored alternative learning program, or a trip that is directly related to the regular curriculum of a student for which he or she earns credit.

(b) Every student enrolled in grade 12 or below in any entity listed in subsection (a) of Section 1-182 of this Code who is transported in a vehicle that is being operated by or for a public or private primary or secondary school, including any primary or secondary school operated by a religious institution, for an interscholastic, interscholastic-athletic, or school-sponsored, noncurriculum-related activity that (i)

- 1 does not require student participation as part of the
- 2 educational services of the entity and (ii) is not associated
- 3 with the students' regular class-for-credit schedule shall
- 4 transport students only in a school bus or vehicle described in
- 5 subsection (b) of Section 1-182 of this Code. This subsection
- 6 (b) does not apply to any second division vehicle used by an
- 7 entity listed in subsection (a) of Section 1-182 of this Code
- 8 for a parade, homecoming, or a similar noncurriculum-related
- 9 school activity.
