- Section 5. The Child Care Act of 1969 is amended by adding Section 7.10 as follows:
- 6 (225 ILCS 10/7.10 new)
- 7 <u>Sec. 7.10. Progress report.</u>
- 8 (a) For the purposes of this Section, "child day care
 9 licensing" or "day care licensing" means licensing of day care
 10 centers, day care homes, and group day care homes.
- 11 (b) No later than June 30, 2013, the Department shall
 12 provide the General Assembly with a comprehensive report on its
 13 progress in meeting performance measures and goals related to

- (c) The report shall include:
