Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

8 Section 15. The amounts appropriated for repairs and 9 maintenance, and other capital improvements in Section 10 for repairs and maintenance, roof repairs and/or replacements and 10 11 miscellaneous capital improvements at the Department's 12 various institutions are to include construction, 13 reconstruction, improvements, repairs and installation of capital facilities, costs of planning, supplies, materials 14 15 and all other expenses required for roof and other types of repairs and maintenance, capital improvements, and purchase 16 17 of land.

No contract shall be entered into or obligation incurred for repairs and maintenance and other capital improvements from appropriations made in Section 10 of this Article until after the purpose and amounts have been approved in writing by the Governor.

- 1 Section 20. The sum of \$40,100, or so much thereof as
- 2 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of
- 3 Juvenile Justice from the General Revenue Fund for costs and
- 4 expenses associated with payment of statewide
- 5 hospitalization.
- 6 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect July 1,
- 7 2012.
