Upon completing his or her examination, he or she shall make a daily record of the same either by calling out the results of the examination to a recorder or by personally recording the report. The mine examination report is in a book kept for that purpose, for the information of the company, the State Mine Inspector, and all other persons interested; and this report record shall be recorded made each morning before the miners are permitted to enter the mine.
