1 AN ACT concerning education.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The School Code is amended by adding Section
- 5 21B-27 as follows:
- 6 (105 ILCS 5/21B-27 new)
- 7 <u>Sec. 21B-27. Provisional certificate.</u>
- (a) The State Educator Preparation and Licensure Board may 8 issue a provisional certificate valid for teaching in early childhood, elementary school, high school, or special subject 10 fields, for providing services as school service personnel, or 11 12 for administering schools, subject to the following conditions: a provisional certificate may be issued to a person 13 14 who meets the requirements for a regular teaching, school service personnel, or administrative certificate in another 15 16 state and who presents certified evidence of having earned a 17 bachelor's degree from a recognized institution of higher learning. The academic and professional courses offered as a 18 19 basis of the provisional certificate shall be courses approved 20 by the State Board of Education, in consultation with the State 21 Educator Preparation and Licensure Board. A certificate earned

under this plan is valid for a period of 2 years and shall not

23 be renewed.

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- (b) The State Educator Preparation and Licensure Board may also issue a provisional vocational certificate and a temporary provisional vocational certificate.
 - (1) The requirements for a provisional vocational certificate shall be determined by the State Board of Education, in consultation with the State Educator Preparation and Licensure Board, provided the following minimum requirements are met: at least 60 semester hours of credit from a recognized institution of higher learning. A bachelor's degree is not required for this certificate.
 - (2) The requirements for a temporary provisional vocational certificate shall be determined by the State Board of Education, in consultation with the State Educator Preparation and Licensure Board, provided the following minimum requirements are met: at least 8,000 hours of work experience in the skill to be certified for teaching. Any certificate issued under the provisions of this paragraph (2) shall expire on June 30 following the date of issue. Renewals may be granted on a yearly basis, but shall not be granted to any person who does not file with the State Educator Preparation and Licensure Board a transcript showing at least 3 semester hours of credit earned during the previous year in a recognized institution of learning. No such certificate shall be issued except upon certification by the employing board, subject to the approval of the regional superintendent of schools, that no

The courses or work experience offered as a basis for the issuance of the provisional vocational certificate or the temporary provisional vocational certificate shall be approved by the State Board of Education, in consultation with the State Educator Preparation and Licensure Board.

(c) Notwithstanding anything in this Code to the contrary, the State Educator Preparation and Licensure Board shall issue part-time provisional certificates to eligible individuals who are professionals and craftsmen.

The requirements for a part-time provisional certificate shall be determined by the State Board of Education, in consultation with the State Educator Preparation and Licensure Board, provided the following minimum requirements are met: 60 semester hours of credit from a recognized institution of higher learning or 4,000 hours of work experience in the skill to be certified for teaching.

A part-time provisional certificate may be issued for teaching no more than 2 courses of study for grades 6 through 12. A part-time provisional certificate shall be valid for 2 years and may be renewed at the end of each 2 year period.

(d) A person who qualifies for a certificate under this Section is not required to hold a license under this Article.
