16	provisional certificate may be issued to	a person who meets the

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1 requirements for a regular teaching, school service personnel, or administrative certificate in another state State and who 2 presents certified evidence of having earned a bachelor's 3 4 degree from a recognized institution of higher learning. The 5 academic and professional courses offered as a basis of the provisional certificate shall be courses approved by the State 6 Board of Education, in consultation with the State Educator 7 8 Preparation and Licensure Teacher Certification Board. A certificate earned under this plan is valid for a period of 2 9 10 years and shall not be renewed.

11 (C) The State <u>Educator Preparation and Licensure</u> <del>Teacher</del> 12 <del>Certification</del> Board may also issue a provisional vocational 13 certificate and a temporary provisional vocational 14 certificate.

15 (1) The requirements for a provisional vocational 16 certificate shall be determined by the State Board of Education, in consultation with the 17 State Educator 18 Preparation and Licensure Teacher Certification Board; 19 provided, the following minimum requirements are met: (a) 20 (blank); after July 1, 1972, at least 30 semester hours of 21 eredit from a recognized institution of higher learning; 22 and (b) after July 1, 1974, at least 60 semester hours of 23 credit from a recognized institution of higher learning. A 24 bachelor's degree is not required for this certificate.

(2) The requirements for a temporary provisional
 vocational certificate shall be determined by the State

Board of Education, in consultation with the State Educator 1 2 Preparation and Licensure Teacher Certification Board; 3 provided, the following minimum requirements are met: (a) (blank); after July 1, 1973, at least 4,000 hours of work 4 5 experience in the skill to be certified for teaching; and (b) after July 1, 1975, at least 8,000 hours of work 6 experience in the skill to be certified for teaching. Any 7 8 certificate issued under the provisions of this paragraph 9 (2) shall expire on June 30 following the date of issue. 10 Renewals may be granted on a yearly basis, but shall not be granted to any person who does not file with the State 11 Educator Preparation and Licensure Teacher Certification 12 13 Board a transcript showing at least 3 semester hours of 14 credit earned during the previous year in a recognized 15 institution of learning. No such certificate shall be issued except upon certification by the employing board, 16 17 subject to the approval of the regional superintendent of 18 schools, that no qualified teacher holding a regular 19 certificate or license or a provisional vocational 20 certificate is available and that actual circumstances and 21 need require such issuance.

The courses or work experience offered as a basis for the issuance of the provisional vocational certificate or the temporary provisional vocational certificate shall be approved by the State Board of Education, in consultation with the State Educator Preparation and Licensure Teacher Certification 1 Board.

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(D) (Blank).

3 (E) Notwithstanding anything in this <u>Code</u> Act to the 4 contrary, the State <u>Educator Preparation and Licensure</u> <del>Teacher</del> 5 <del>Certification</del> Board shall issue part-time provisional 6 certificates to eligible individuals who are professionals and 7 craftsmen.

8 The requirements for a part-time provisional teachers 9 certificate shall be determined by the State Board of 10 Education, in consultation with the State Educator Preparation 11 and Licensure Teacher Certification Board, provided the following minimum requirements are met: 60 semester hours of 12 13 credit from a recognized institution of higher learning or 4,000 4000 hours of work experience in the skill to be 14 15 certified for teaching.

16 A part-time provisional certificate may be issued for 17 teaching no more than 2 courses of study for grades 6 through 18 12.

19 A part-time provisional teachers certificate shall be 20 valid for 2 years and may be renewed at the end of each 2 year 21 period.

(F) (Blank). This Section is repealed on June 30, 2013.
(G) A person who qualifies for a certificate under this
Section is not required to hold a license under Article 21B of
this Code.
