1 AN ACT concerning education.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing Section
- 5 14-1.09.2 as follows:
- 6 (105 ILCS 5/14-1.09.2)
- 7 Sec. 14-1.09.2. School Social Work Services. In the public
- 8 schools, social work services may be provided by qualified
- 9 specialists who hold Type 73 School Service Personnel
- 10 Certificates endorsed for school social work issued by the
- 11 State Teacher Certification Board or who hold a Professional
- 12 Educator License with a school support personnel endorsement in
- the area of school social worker under Section 21B-25 of this
- 14 Code.
- 15 School social work services may include, but are not
- 16 limited to:
- 17 (1) Identifying students in need of special education
- services by conducting a social-developmental study in a
- 19 case study evaluation;
- 20 (2) Developing and implementing comprehensive
- interventions with students, parents, and teachers that
- 22 will enhance student adjustment to, and performance in, the
- 23 school setting;

- (3) Consulting and collaborating with teachers and other school personnel regarding behavior management and intervention plans and inclusion in support of special education students in regular classroom settings;
- (4) Counseling with students, parents, and teachers in accordance with the rules and regulations governing provision of related services, provided that parent permission must be obtained in writing before a student participates in a group counseling session;
- (5) Acting as a liaison between the public schools and community resources;
- (6) Developing and implementing school-based prevention programs, including mediation and violence prevention, implementing social and emotional education programs and services, and establishing and implementing bullying prevention and intervention programs;
- (7) Providing crisis intervention within the school setting;
- (8) Supervising school social work interns enrolled in school social work programs that meet the standards established by the State Board of Education;
- (9) Providing parent education and counseling as appropriate in relation to the child's educational assessment; and
- (10) Assisting in completing a functional behavioral assessment, as well as assisting in the development of

- nonaversive behavioral intervention strategies; and-
- 2 <u>(11) Evaluating program effectiveness.</u>
- 3 Nothing in this Section prohibits other certified
- 4 professionals from providing any of the services listed in this
- 5 Section for which they are appropriately trained.

- 7 Section 10. The Children's Mental Health Act of 2003 is
- 8 amended by changing Section 15 as follows:
- 9 (405 ILCS 49/15)
- 10 Sec. 15. Mental health and schools.
- 11 (a) The Illinois State Board of Education shall develop and
- 12 implement a plan to incorporate social and emotional
- development standards as part of the Illinois Learning
- 14 Standards for the purpose of enhancing and measuring children's
- school readiness and ability to achieve academic success. The
- 16 plan shall be submitted to the Governor, the General Assembly,
- and the Partnership by December 31, 2004.
- 18 (b) Every Illinois school district shall develop a policy
- 19 for incorporating social and emotional development into the
- 20 district's educational program. The policy shall address
- 21 teaching and assessing social and emotional skills and
- 22 protocols for responding to children with social, emotional, or
- 23 mental health problems, or a combination of such problems, that
- 24 impact learning ability. School social workers may implement a

- 1 continuum of social and emotional education programs and
- 2 services in accordance with students' needs. Each district must
- 3 submit this policy to the Illinois State Board of Education by
- August 31, 2004. 4
