

98TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2013 and 2014 HB2501

SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

305 ILCS 5/5-5.4h new

Amends the Medical Assistance Article of the Illinois Public Aid Code. Requires the Department of Healthcare and Family Services to adopt rules which establish a policy of bed reserve payments to Intermediate Care Facilities for the Developmentally Disabled (ICF/DDs) which addresses the needs of facility residents and their families. Requires the Department to set, by rule, certain bed reserve payment rates based on the length of time a resident of an ICF/DD is absent from the ICF/DD (i) for purposes of a physician-authorized in-patient admission to a hospital or (ii) for purposes of a home visit with a family member. Provides that no Department rule regarding bed reserve payments shall require an ICF/DD to have a specified percentage of total facility occupancy as a requirement for receiving bed reserve payments. Exempts State-operated facilities from the provisions of this amendatory Act. Effective immediately.

FISCAL NOTE ACT MAY APPLY

1 AN ACT concerning public aid.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Illinois Public Aid Code is amended by adding Section 5-5.4h as follows:
- 6 (305 ILCS 5/5-5.4h new)
- Sec. 5-5.4h. Intermediate Care Facility for the
- 8 <u>Developmentally Disabled; bed reserve payments.</u>
- 9 <u>(a) In this Section, "ICF/DD" means an Intermediate Care</u>
 10 Facility for the Developmentally Disabled.
- 11 <u>(b) The Department shall adopt rules which establish a</u>
 12 policy of bed reserve payments to ICF/DDs which addresses the
 13 needs of residents of ICF/DDs and their families.
- 14 (c) When a resident of an ICF/DD is absent from the ICF/DD in which he or she is a resident for purposes of a 15 16 physician-authorized in-patient admission to a hospital, the 17 Department's rules shall, at a minimum, provide: (1) bed reserve payments at a daily rate which is 100% of the client's 18 current per diem rate, for a period not exceeding 10 19 20 consecutive days; (2) bed reserve payments at a daily rate 21 which is 75% of a client's current per diem rate, for a period 22 which exceeds 10 consecutive days but does not exceed 30 consecutive days; and (3) bed reserve payments at a daily rate 2.3

- 1 which is 50% of a client's current per diem rate for a period
- 2 which exceeds 30 consecutive days but does not exceed 45
- 3 <u>consecutive days.</u>
- 4 (d) When a resident of an ICF/DD is absent from the ICF/DD
- 5 in which he or she is a resident for purposes of a home visit
- 6 with a family member, the Department's rules shall, at a
- 7 minimum, provide: (1) bed reserve payments at a rate which is
- 8 100% of a client's current per diem rate, for a period not
- 9 exceeding 10 days per State fiscal year; and (2) bed reserve
- payments at a rate which is 75% of a client's current per diem
- 11 rate, for a period which exceeds 10 days per State fiscal year
- but does not exceed 30 days per State fiscal year.
- 13 (e) No Department rule regarding bed reserve payments shall
- 14 require an ICF/DD to have a specified percentage of total
- 15 facility occupancy as a requirement for receiving bed reserve
- payments.
- 17 (f) This Section 5-5.4h does not apply to any
- 18 State-operated facility.
- 19 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon
- 20 becoming law.
