## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

625 ILCS 5/11-1303

from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 11-1303

Amends the Illinois Vehicle Code. Prohibits stopping, standing, or parking a vehicle within 5 feet of a public or private driveway except momentarily to pick up or discharge passengers.

1 AN ACT concerning transportation.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by changing

  Section 11-1303 as follows:
- 6 (625 ILCS 5/11-1303) (from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 11-1303)
- Sec. 11-1303. Stopping, standing or parking prohibited in specified places.
- 9 (a) Except when necessary to avoid conflict with other 10 traffic, or in compliance with law or the directions of a 11 police officer or official traffic-control device, no person 12 shall:
- 1. Stop, stand or park a vehicle:
- a. On the roadway side of any vehicle stopped or parked at the edge or curb of a street;
- b. On a sidewalk;
- 17 c. Within an intersection;
- d. On a crosswalk;
- e. Between a safety zone and the adjacent curb or within 30 feet of points on the curb immediately opposite the ends of a safety zone, unless a different length is indicated by signs or markings;
- f. Alongside or opposite any street excavation or

1	obstruction when stopping, standing or parking would
2	obstruct traffic;
3	g. Upon any bridge or other elevated structure upon
4	a highway or within a highway tunnel;
5	h. On any railroad tracks. A violation of any part
6	of this subparagraph h. shall result in a mandatory
7	fine of \$500 or 50 hours of community service.
8	i. At any place where official signs prohibit
9	stopping;
10	j. On any controlled-access highway;
11	k. In the area between roadways of a divided
12	highway, including crossovers;
13	1. In a public parking area if the vehicle does not
14	display a current annual registration sticker or
15	current temporary permit pending registration.
16	2. Stand or park a vehicle, whether occupied or not,
17	except momentarily to pick up or discharge passengers:
18	a. <u>Within 5 feet</u> <del>In front</del> of a public or private
19	driveway;
20	b. Within 15 feet of a fire hydrant;
21	c. Within 20 feet of a crosswalk at an
22	intersection;
23	d. Within 30 feet upon the approach to any flashing
24	signal, stop sign, yield sign, or traffic control
25	signal located at the side of a roadway;
26	e. Within 20 feet of the driveway entrance to any

fire station and on the side of a street opposite the 1 2 entrance to any fire station within 75 feet of such entrance (when properly sign-posted); 3 f. At any place where official signs prohibit 4 5 standing. 6 3. Park a vehicle, whether occupied or not, except 7 temporarily for the purpose of and while actually engaged in loading or unloading property or passengers: 8 a. Within 50 feet of the nearest rail of a railroad 9 10 crossing; 11 b. At any place where official signs prohibit 12 parking. 13 (b) No person shall move a vehicle not lawfully under his control into any such prohibited area or away from a curb such 14 distance as is unlawful. 15
