### SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

60 ILCS 1/45-10

Amends the Township Code. Provides that if the chairman of the township central committee fails to notify the township clerk by first-class mail of the time and location of the political party's caucus not less than 20 days before the caucus, the caucus shall not be held at the time and location. Effective immediately.

# 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Township Code is amended by changing Section
45-10 as follows:

Sec. 45-10. Political party caucus in township; notice.

8 (a) On the first Tuesday in December preceding the date of 9 the regular township election, a caucus shall be held by the voters of each established political party in a township to 10 nominate its candidates for the various offices to be filled at 11 the election. Notice of the caucus shall be given at least 10 12 13 days before it is held by publication in some newspaper having 14 a general circulation in the township. Not less than 30 days before the caucus, the township clerk shall notify the chairman 15 16 or membership of each township central committee by first-class 17 mail of the chairman's or membership's obligation to report the time and location of the political party's caucus. Not less 18 19 than 20 days before the caucus, each chairman of the township 20 committee shall notify the township clerk central bv 21 first-class mail of the time and location of the political party's caucus. If the time and location of 2 or more political 22 party caucuses conflict, the township clerk shall establish, by 23

1 a fair and impartial public lottery, the time and location for 2 each caucus.

3 If the chairman of the township central committee fails to
4 notify the township clerk by first-class mail of the time and
5 location of the political party's caucus not less than 20 days
6 before the caucus, the caucus shall not be held at that time
7 and location.

8 (b) Except as provided in this Section, the township board 9 shall cause notices of the caucuses to be published. The notice 10 shall state the time and place where the caucus for each 11 political party will be held. The board shall fix a place 12 within the township for holding the caucus for each established 13 political party. When a new township has been established under Section 10-25, the county board shall cause notice of the 14 15 caucuses to be published as required by this Section and shall 16 fix the place within the new township for holding the caucuses. 17 (Source: P.A. 97-81, eff. 7-5-11.)

Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon becoming law.
