SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

25 ILCS 120/5.8 25 ILCS 120/5.9 25 ILCS 120/6.1 new

Amends the Compensation Review Act. Prohibits cost-of-living adjustments for or during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2013, and for each fiscal year thereafter for State government legislative and executive elected officers and appointees in positions for which the Compensation Review Board previously recommended or determined compensation. Effective immediately.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Compensation Review Act is amended by 5 changing Sections 5.8 and 5.9 and by adding Section 6.1 as 6 follows:

5.8. FY12 COLAs prohibited. Notwithstanding 8 Sec. any 9 former or current provision of this Act, any other law, any report of the Compensation Review Board, or any resolution of 10 the General Assembly to the contrary, members of the General 11 Assembly, State's attorneys, other than the county supplement, 12 elected executive branch constitutional officers of State 13 14 government, and persons in certain appointed offices of State government, including the membership of State departments, 15 16 agencies, boards, and commissions, whose annual compensation 17 previously was recommended or determined by the Compensation Review Board, are prohibited from receiving and shall not 18 19 receive any increase in compensation that would otherwise apply 20 based on a cost of living adjustment, as authorized by Senate 21 Joint Resolution 192 of the 86th General Assembly, for or 22 during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2011. That cost of living adjustment shall apply again in the fiscal year 23

Notwithstanding anv 5 former or current provision of this Act, any other law, any 6 report of the Compensation Review Board, or any resolution of the General Assembly to the contrary, members of the General 7 8 Assembly, State's attorneys, other than the county supplement, elected executive branch constitutional officers of State 9 10 government, and persons in certain appointed offices of State 11 government, including the membership of State departments, 12 agencies, boards, and commissions, whose annual compensation 13 previously was recommended or determined by the Compensation Review Board, are prohibited from receiving and shall not 14 15 receive any increase in compensation that would otherwise apply 16 based on a cost of living adjustment, as authorized by Senate Joint Resolution 192 of the 86th General Assembly, for or 17 during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2012. 1 Compensation Review Board, or any resolution of the General Assembly to the contrary, members of the General Assembly, 2 3 State's attorneys, other than the county supplement, elected 4 executive branch constitutional officers of State government, 5 and persons in certain appointed offices of State government, 6 including the membership of State departments, agencies, boards, and commissions, whose annual compensation previously 7 8 was recommended or determined by the Compensation Review Board, 9 are prohibited from receiving and shall not receive any increase in compensation that would otherwise apply based on a 10 11 cost of living adjustment, as authorized by Senate Joint 12 Resolution 192 of the 86th General Assembly, for or during the 13 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2013, and for each fiscal year 14 thereafter.

Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon becoming law.

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
