1 law, vehicles with remaining useful life may be recycled into the State vehicle fleet to replace mission critical vehicles 2 with higher maintenance costs to reduce the overall cost of 3 4 maintaining the fleet. The 7,000 mile requirement set forth in 5 this Section includes all miles driven, including all miles 6 driven while on official State business and all miles driven while not on official State business. This Section does not 7 apply to vehicles driven by police or law enforcement personnel 8 while on duty, vehicles driven by employees of public 9 10 universities of the State, or to emergency vehicles, snow 11 plows, or heavy equipment vehicles. Proceeds from the sale of 12 each surplus vehicle under this Section shall be deposited in 13 the same manner as proceeds from the sale of surplus vehicles 14 for that vehicle's particular agency under current law. 15 Exceptions to this Section may be granted by the Department for 16 vehicles identified in the Performance Audit of the State Vehicles Fleet released by the Office of the Auditor General in 17 November 2011 to have been driven 7,000 miles or less in Fiscal 18 Year 2010 if the exception is justified under agency head 19 20 signature because the vehicle is mission critical for State 21 business that could not otherwise be performed without the 22 vehicle. Other exceptions may be granted by the Department if 23 the Agency certifies to the Department that the vehicle was 24 driven at least 15,000 additional miles after the date of the 25 audit and before the end of Fiscal Year 2012.

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Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon
becoming law.".
