Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

4 ARTICLE 1

5 ARCHITECT OF THE CAPITOL

Section 5. The amount of \$3,883, or so much of thereof 6 7 as may be necessary and remains unexpended on June 30, 2013, 8 from a reappropriation heretofore made for such purpose in 5 of Article 9 8 of Public Act 97-0725, 10 reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund to the 11 Office of the Architect of the Capitol for 12 specifications, and continuation of work pursuant to the 13 report and recommendations of the architectural, structural, 14 and mechanical surveys of the State Capitol Building. 15 is for the continuation of the rehabilitation of the Capitol 16 Building.

Section 10. The sum of \$548,180, or so much thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business on June 30, 2013, from a reappropriation heretofore made for such purposes in Section 10 of Article 8 of Public Act 97-0725, is reappropriated from the Capital Development
