SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

Amends the Humane Care for Animals Act and the Humane Euthanasia in Animal Shelters Act. Prohibits the use of carbon monoxide as a euthanasia agent for companion animals. Provides that euthanasia of a companion animal shall only be performed using established injectable euthanasia agents. Provides that the use of other euthanasia agents on companion animals is aggravated cruelty.

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AN ACT concerning animals.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Humane Care for Animals Act is amended by 5 changing Sections 3.02 and 8 as follows:

6 (510 ILCS 70/3.02)

7 Sec. 3.02. Aggravated cruelty.

8 (a) No person may intentionally commit an act that causes a 9 companion animal to suffer serious injury or death. Aggravated 10 cruelty does not include euthanasia of a companion animal 11 through recognized methods approved by the Department of 12 Agriculture unless prohibited under subsection (b).

(b) No <u>person</u> individual, except a licensed veterinarian as exempted under Section 3.09, may knowingly or intentionally euthanize or authorize the euthanasia of a companion animal by use of carbon monoxide. <u>Euthanasia of a companion animal shall</u> only be performed using established injectable euthanasia agents.

(c) A person convicted of violating Section 3.02 is guilty of a Class 4 felony. A second or subsequent violation is a Class 3 felony. In addition to any other penalty provided by law, upon conviction for violating this Section, the court may order the convicted person to undergo a psychological or HB3767 - 2 - LRB098 14794 MGM 49730 b

psychiatric evaluation and to undergo any treatment at the 1 2 convicted person's expense that the court determines to be appropriate after due consideration of the evaluation. If the 3 convicted person is a juvenile or a companion animal hoarder, 4 5 the court must order the convicted person to undergo a psychological or psychiatric evaluation and to 6 undergo 7 treatment that the court determines to be appropriate after due consideration of the evaluation. 8

11 Sec. 8. Rulemaking.

12 The Department shall administer this Act and shall adopt 13 promulgate such rules and regulations as are necessary to effectuate the purposes of this Act. These Such rules and 14 regulations are subject to the approval of the Advisory Board 15 16 of Livestock Commissioners. No later than 6 months after the 17 effective date of this amendatory Act of the 96th General 18 Assembly, the Department shall adopt rules defining the 19 "recognized methods for the humane euthanasia of companion 20 animals" referred to in subsection (a) of Section 3.02 of this 21 Act. No later than 6 months after the effective date of this 22 amendatory Act of the 98th General Assembly, the Department shall adopt rules defining "established injectable euthanasia 23 24 agents" as used in this Act subject to the approval of the 25 Advisory Board of Livestock Commissioners.

The Humane Euthanasia in Animal Shelters Act is 9 amended by changing Sections 5, 35, and 57 as follows: 10 (510 ILCS 72/5) Sec. 5. Definitions. The following terms have the meanings 11 12 indicated, unless the context requires otherwise: 13 "Animal" means any bird, fish, reptile, or mammal other 14 than man. 15 "DEA" means the United States Department of Justice Drug Enforcement Administration. 16 17 "Department" means the Department of Professional 18 Regulation. 19 "Director" means the Director of the Department of 20 Professional Regulation. "Euthanasia agency" means an entity certified by the 21 Department for the purpose of animal euthanasia that holds an 22 animal control facility or animal shelter license under the 23

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Animal Welfare Act and that permits only euthanasia technicians
 or veterinarians to perform the euthanasia of animals.

3 "Euthanasia drugs" means Schedule II or Schedule III 4 substances (nonnarcotic controlled substances) as set forth in 5 the Illinois Controlled Substances Act that are used by a 6 euthanasia agency for the purpose of animal euthanasia. 7 <u>"Euthanasia drugs" include only established injectable</u> 8 euthanasia agents.

9 "Euthanasia technician" or "technician" means a person 10 employed by a euthanasia agency or working under the direct 11 supervision of a veterinarian and who is certified by the 12 Department to administer euthanasia drugs to euthanize 13 animals.

14 "Veterinarian" means a person holding the degree of Doctor 15 of Veterinary Medicine who is licensed under the Veterinary 16 Medicine and Surgery Practice Act of 2004.

19 Sec. 35. Technician certification; duties.

(a) An applicant for certification as a euthanasia
 technician shall file an application with the Department and
 shall:

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(1) Be 18 years of age.

24 (2) Be of good moral character. In determining moral25 character under this Section, the Department may take into

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consideration whether the applicant has engaged in conduct or activities that would constitute grounds for discipline under this Act.

(3) Each applicant for certification as a euthanasia 4 5 technician shall have his or her fingerprints submitted to 6 the Department of State Police in an electronic format that 7 complies with the form and manner for requesting and 8 furnishing criminal history record information as 9 prescribed by the Department of State Police. These 10 fingerprints shall be checked against the Department of 11 State Police and Federal Bureau of Investigation criminal 12 history record databases now and hereafter filed. The 13 Department of State Police shall charge applicants a fee 14 for conducting the criminal history records check, which 15 shall be deposited in the State Police Services Fund and shall not exceed the actual cost of the records check. The 16 17 Department of State Police shall furnish, pursuant to positive identification, records of Illinois convictions 18 19 to the Department.

20 (4) Hold a license or certification from the American 21 Humane Association, the National Animal Control 22 Association, the Illinois Federation of Humane Societies, 23 or the Humane Society of the United States issued within 3 24 years preceding the date of application. Every 5 years a 25 certified euthanasia technician must renew his or her 26 certification with the Department. At the time of renewal,

the technician must present proof that he or she attended a class or seminar, administered by the American Humane Association, the National Animal Control Association, the Illinois Federation of Humane Societies, or the Humane Society of the United States, that teaches techniques or guidelines, or both, for humane animal euthanasia.

(5) Pay the required fee.

8 (b) The duties of a euthanasia technician shall include but 9 are not limited to:

(1) preparing animals for euthanasia and scanning each
 animal, prior to euthanasia, for microchips;

12 (2) accurately recording the dosages administered and13 the amount of drugs wasted;

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(3) ordering supplies;

15 (4) maintaining the security of all controlled 16 substances and drugs;

17 (5) humanely euthanizing animals via intravenous 18 injection by hypodermic needle, intraperitoneal injection 19 by hypodermic needle, or intracardiac injection only on 20 comatose animals by hypodermic needle; and

21 (6) properly disposing of euthanized animals after22 verification of death.

(c) A euthanasia technician employed by a euthanasia agency
may perform euthanasia by the administration of a Schedule II
or Schedule III nonnarcotic controlled substance. A euthanasia
technician may not personally possess, order, or administer a

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controlled substance except as an agent of the euthanasia
 agency. <u>When performing euthanasia</u>, a euthanasia technician
 <u>shall only use established injectable euthanasia agents.</u>

4 (d) Upon termination from a euthanasia agency, a euthanasia
5 technician shall not perform animal euthanasia until he or she
6 is employed by another certified euthanasia agency.

7 (e) A certified euthanasia technician or an instructor in 8 an approved course does not engage in the practice of 9 veterinary medicine when performing duties set forth in this 10 Act.

13 Sec. 57. Procedures for euthanasia.

14 (a) Only euthanasia drugs shall be used for the purpose of 15 humanely euthanizing injured, sick, homeless, or unwanted 16 companion animals in an animal shelter or an animal control facility licensed under the Illinois Animal Welfare Act, except 17 18 that a licensed veterinarian may euthanize companion animals in such a shelter or facility by the use of carbon monoxide if the 19 20 veterinarian complies with the requirements set forth in Section 3.09 of the Humane Care for Animals Act. Euthanasia by 21 22 a certified euthanasia technician shall be conducted only within the physical premises of an animal shelter licensed 23 24 under the Animal Welfare Act or an animal control facility 25 licensed under the Animal Welfare Act, except that a certified

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euthanasia technician employed by an animal control facility
licensed under the Animal Welfare Act may euthanize animals in
the field in emergency situations.

5 (c) Animals cannot be transported beyond State lines for 6 the sole purpose of euthanasia unless the euthanasia is 7 performed by a licensed veterinarian in a manner that is 8 consistent with subsection (a) of this Section.
