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AN ACT concerning State government.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The State Comptroller Act is amended by changing
Section 23.9 as follows:

6 (15 ILCS 405/23.9)

7 Sec. 23.9. Minority Contractor Opportunity Initiative. The 8 State Comptroller Minority Contractor Opportunity Initiative 9 is created to provide greater opportunities for minority-owned businesses, female-owned businesses, businesses owned by 10 persons with disabilities, and small businesses with 20 or 11 12 fewer employees in this State to participate in the State 13 procurement process. The initiative shall be administered by 14 the Comptroller. Under this initiative, the Comptroller is responsible for the following: (i) outreach to minority-owned 15 16 businesses, female-owned businesses, businesses owned by 17 persons with disabilities, and small businesses capable of providing services to the 18 State; (ii) education of minority-owned businesses, female-owned businesses, businesses 19 20 owned by persons with disabilities, and small businesses 21 concerning State contracting and procurement; (iii) 22 notification of minority-owned businesses, female-owned businesses, businesses owned by persons with disabilities, and 23

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small businesses of State contracting opportunities; and (iv) 1 2 maintenance of an online database of State contracts that 3 identifies the contracts awarded to minority-owned businesses, female-owned businesses, businesses owned by persons with 4 5 disabilities, and small businesses that includes the total amount paid by State agencies to contractors and the percentage 6 7 paid to minority-owned businesses, female-owned businesses, 8 businesses owned by persons with disabilities, and small 9 businesses.

10 The Comptroller shall work with the Business Enterprise 11 Council created under Section 5 of the Business Enterprise for 12 Minorities, Females, and Persons with Disabilities Act to 13 fulfill the Comptroller's responsibilities under this Section. 14 The Comptroller may rely on the Business Enterprise Council's 15 identification of minority-owned businesses, female-owned 16 businesses, and businesses owned by persons with disabilities.

17 The Comptroller shall annually prepare and submit a report to the Governor and the General Assembly concerning the 18 19 progress of this initiative including the following 20 information for the preceding calendar year: (i) a statement of the total amounts paid by each executive branch agency to 21 22 contractors since the previous report; (ii) the percentage of 23 the amounts that were paid to minority-owned businesses, female-owned businesses, businesses owned by persons with 24 25 disabilities, and small businesses; (iii) the successes 26 achieved and the challenges faced by the Comptroller in HB3831 Engrossed - 3 - LRB098 15383 HLH 50412 b

operating outreach programs for minorities, women, persons 1 2 with disabilities, and small businesses; (iv) the challenges 3 each executive branch agency may face in hiring qualified minority, female, disabled, and small business employees and 4 5 contracting with qualified minority-owned businesses, 6 female-owned businesses, businesses owned by persons with 7 disabilities, and small businesses; and (iv) any other 8 information, findings, conclusions, and recommendations for 9 legislative or agency action, as the Comptroller deems 10 appropriate.

On and after the effective date of this amendatory Act of 11 12 the 97th General Assembly, any bidder or offeror awarded a 13 contract of \$1,000 or more under Section 20-10, 20-15, 20-25, 14 or 20-30 of the Illinois Procurement Code is required to pay a 15 fee of \$15 to cover expenses related to the administration of 16 this Section. The Comptroller shall deduct the fee from the 17 first check issued to the vendor under the contract and deposit the fee into the Comptroller's Administrative Fund. Contracts 18 19 administered for statewide orders placed by agencies (commonly 20 referred to as "statewide master contracts") are exempt from 21 this fee.
