SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

210 ILCS 50/3.87

Amends the Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Systems Act. Provides that if the Department of Public Health approves a service upgrade for an ambulance service provider that serves a rural population of 7,500 or fewer inhabitants, then the ambulance service provider is authorized to operate at the highest level of EMT license or Pre-Hospital RN certification (currently, highest level of EMT license) held by any person staffing the ambulance.

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AN ACT concerning regulation.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Systems Act
is amended by changing Section 3.87 as follows:

6 (210 ILCS 50/3.87)

Sec. 3.87. Ambulance service upgrades; rural population.

8 (a) In this Section, "rural ambulance service provider" 9 means an ambulance service provider licensed under this Act 10 that serves a rural population of 7,500 or fewer inhabitants.

(b) A rural ambulance service provider may submit a proposal to the EMS System Medical Director requesting approval of either or both of the following:

14 (1) Rural ambulance service provider in-field service15 level upgrade.

16 (A) An ambulance operated by a rural ambulance 17 service provider may be upgraded, as defined by the EMS System Medical Director in a policy or procedure, as 18 long as the EMS System Medical Director and the 19 20 Department have approved the proposal, to the highest 21 level of EMT license (advanced life support/paramedic, 22 intermediate life support, or basic life support) or Pre-Hospital RN certification held by any person 23

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staffing that ambulance. The ambulance service provider's proposal for an upgrade must include all of the following:

4 (i) The manner in which the provider will
5 secure advanced life support equipment, supplies,
6 and medications.

7 (ii) The type of quality assurance the8 provider will perform.

9 (iii) An assurance that the provider will 10 advertise only the level of care that can be 11 provided 24 hours a day.

12 (B) If a rural ambulance service provider is 13 approved to provide an in-field service level upgrade 14 based on the licensed personnel on the vehicle, all the 15 advanced life support medical supplies, durable 16 medical equipment, and medications must be secured and 17 locked with access by only the personnel who have been authorized by the EMS System Medical Director to 18 19 utilize those supplies.

(C) The EMS System shall routinely perform quality
 assurance, in compliance with the EMS System's quality
 assurance plan approved by the Department, on in-field
 service level upgrades authorized under this Section
 to ensure compliance with the EMS System plan.

(2) Rural ambulance service provider in-field service
 level upgrade. The EMS System Medical Director may define

what constitutes an in-field service level upgrade through 1 2 an EMS System policy or procedure. An in-field service 3 level upgrade may include, but need not be limited to, an upgrade to a licensed ambulance, alternate response 4 5 vehicle as defined by the Department in rules, or specialized emergency medical services vehicle. 6

7 (c) If the EMS System Medical Director approves a proposal for a rural in-field service level upgrade under this Section, 8 9 he or she shall submit the proposal to the Department along 10 with a statement of approval signed by him or her. Once the 11 Department has approved the proposal, the rural ambulance 12 service provider will be authorized to function at the highest EMT 13 level of license (advanced life support/paramedic, support, or basic 14 intermediate life life support) or Pre-Hospital RN certification held by any person staffing the 15 16 vehicle.
