The Department of Professional Regulation Law 4 5 of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois is amended by 6 adding Section 2105-17 as follows: 7 (20 ILCS 2105/2105-17 new) Sec. 2105-17. Volunteer licenses. 8 (a) For the purposes of this Section: 9 10 "Health care professional" means a physician licensed 11 under the Medical Practice Act of 1987, a dentist licensed under the Illinois Dental Practice Act, a physician assistant 12 licensed under the Physician Assistant Practice Act of 1987, 13 and a nurse or advanced practice nurse licensed under the Nurse 14 15 Practice Act. The Department may expand this definition by

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1	"Volunteer practice" means the practice of a licensed
2	health care profession for the benefit of an individual or the
3	public and without compensation for the health care services
4	provided. "Compensation" does not include malpractice coverage
5	provided by a free medical clinic or public health clinic for a
6	health care professional.
7	(b) The Department may grant a volunteer license to a
8	health care professional who:
9	(1) meets all requirements of the State licensing Act
10	that applies to his or her health care profession and the
11	rules adopted under the Act; and
12	(2) agrees to engage in the volunteer practice of his
13	or her health care profession in a free medical clinic, as
14	defined in the Good Samaritan Act, or in a public health
15	clinic, as defined in Section 6-101 of the Local
16	Governmental and Governmental Employees Tort Immunities
17	Act, and to not practice for compensation.
18	(c) A volunteer license shall be granted in accordance with
19	the licensing Act that applies to the health care
20	professional's given health care profession, and the licensure
21	fee shall be set by rule in accordance with subsection (f).
22	(d) No health care professional shall hold a non-volunteer
23	license in a health care profession and a volunteer license in
24	that profession at the same time. In the event that the health
25	care professional obtains a volunteer license in the profession

for which he or she holds a non-volunteer license, that

- 1 <u>non-volunteer license shall automatically be placed in</u>
- 2 <u>inactive status. In the event that a health care professional</u>
- 3 <u>obtains a non-volunteer license in the profession for which he</u>
- 4 <u>or she holds a volunteer license</u>, the volunteer license shall
- 5 <u>be placed in inactive status. Practicing on an expired</u>
- 6 <u>volunteer license constitutes the unlicensed practice of the</u>
- 7 <u>health care professional's profession.</u>
- 8 (e) Nothing in this Section shall be construed to waive or
- 9 modify any statute, rule, or regulation concerning the
- licensure or practice of any health care profession. A health
- 11 care professional who holds a volunteer license shall be
- subject to all statutes, rules, and regulations governing his
- or her profession. The Department shall waive the licensure fee
- for the first 500 volunteer licenses issued and may by rule
- provide for a fee waiver or fee reduction that shall apply to
- all licenses issued after the initial 500.
- 17 (f) The Department shall determine by rule the total number
- of volunteer licenses to be issued. The Department shall file
- 19 proposed rules implementing this Section within 6 months after
- 20 the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 98th General
- 21 Assembly.
- 22 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon
- 23 becoming law.".
