

## 98TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2013 and 2014 HB5420

## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

225 ILCS 447/10-31 new

Amends the Private Detective, Private Alarm, Private Security, Fingerprint Vendor, and Locksmith Act of 2004. Provides that no licensee shall contract with any non-home rule municipality for the provision of auxiliary police services. Further provides that a licensee may contract with a home rule municipality for the provision of auxiliary police services, provided that each employee who is to act as an auxiliary police officer under the contract is properly appointed by the municipality and has met certain training requirements. Provides that an employee serving as an auxiliary police officer shall perform only those duties provided by the Illinois Municipal Code and shall, at all times during his or her service, comply with all other requirements of the Code.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Private Detective, Private Alarm, Private Security, Fingerprint Vendor, and Locksmith Act of 2004 is amended by adding Section 10-31 as follows:
- 7 (225 ILCS 447/10-31 new)
- Sec. 10-31. Contracts for auxiliary police services. No 8 9 licensee shall contract with any non-home rule municipality for the provision of auxiliary police services under Section 10 3.1-30-20 of the Illinois Municipal Code. A licensee may 11 12 contract with a home rule municipality for the provision of auxiliary police services, provided that each employee who is 13 14 to act as an auxiliary police officer under the contract is properly appointed by the municipality and has met the training 15 16 requirements of Section 3.1-30-20 of the Illinois Municipal 17 Code at the time he or she begins performance of auxiliary police duties. An employee serving as an auxiliary police 18 19 officer shall perform only those duties provided by Section 20 3.1-30-20 of the Illinois Municipal Code and shall comply with 21 all other requirements of Section 3.1-30-20 and of the Illinois 22 Municipal Code.
