1 AN ACT concerning education.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Western Illinois University Law is amended
by changing Sections 35-40 and 35-45 as follows:

6 (110 ILCS 690/35-40)

7 Sec. 35-40. Contracts, conveyances, expenditures. The 8 Board shall have power to enter into contracts and to sue and 9 be sued, provided that any suit against the Board based upon a claim sounding in tort must be filed in the Court of Claims; to 10 acquire by purchase, eminent domain or otherwise, and to hold 11 12 and convey title to real property as it shall deem appropriate 13 and personal property in accordance with the State Property 14 Control Act, except as otherwise provided in item (14) of Section 35-45 of this Law; and to expend the funds appropriated 15 16 to or lawfully belonging to the Western Illinois University, 17 provided that the Board in the exercise of the powers conferred by this Article shall not create any liability or indebtedness 18 of funds from the State Treasury in excess of the funds 19 20 appropriated to Western Illinois University.

All real property acquired by the Board shall be held for the People of the State of Illinois, for the use of Western Illinois University. HB5678 Engrossed - 2 - LRB098 18550 NHT 53688 b

Any lease to the Board of lands, buildings or facilities 1 2 which will support scientific research and development in such areas as high technology, super computing, microelectronics, 3 biotechnology, robotics, physics and engineering shall be for a 4 5 term not to exceed 18 years, and may grant to the Board the option to purchase the lands, buildings or facilities. The 6 lease shall recite that it is subject to termination and 7 8 cancellation in any year for which the General Assembly fails 9 to make an appropriation to pay the rent payable under the 10 terms of the lease.

11 Leases for the purposes described herein exceeding 5 years 12 shall have the approval of the Illinois Board of Higher 13 Education.

The Board's power to enter into contracts includes but is 14 15 not limited to the power to enter into contracts with 16 municipalities within which the University or any branch 17 thereof is located, in whole or in part, for such municipality to provide fire protection or other essential municipal 18 19 services upon properties leased to for-profit entities the 20 title to which properties is held by the Board. The Board shall 21 pay to the municipality concerned such equitable portion of the 22 cost of providing such fire protection or other essential 23 municipal service as shall be agreed to by the Board, and as part of the compensation for such fire protection the Board may 24 provide land and buildings, or either, for fire stations to be 25 26 used by the municipality.

3 Sec. 35-45. Powers and duties. The Board also shall have 4 power and it shall be its duty:

5 (1) To make rules, regulations and bylaws, not inconsistent
6 with law, for the government and management of Western Illinois
7 University and its branches;

8 (2) To employ, and, for good cause, to remove a President 9 of Western Illinois University, and all necessary deans, 10 professors, associate professors, assistant professors, 11 instructors, other educational and administrative assistants, 12 and all other necessary employees, and to prescribe their 13 duties and contract with them upon matters relating to tenure, salaries and retirement benefits in accordance with the State 14 Universities Civil Service Act. Whenever the Board establishes 15 16 a search committee to fill the position of President of Western Illinois University, there shall be minority representation, 17 18 including women, on that search committee. The Board shall, 19 upon the written request of an employee of Western Illinois 20 University, withhold from the compensation of that employee any 21 dues, payments or contributions payable by such employee to any 22 labor organization as defined in the Illinois Educational Labor 23 Relations Act. contributions, and the Board shall transmit such withholdings
 to the specified labor organization within 10 working days from
 the time of the withholding;

4 (3) To prescribe the courses of study to be followed, and
5 textbooks and apparatus to be used at Western Illinois
6 University;

7 (4) To issue upon the recommendation of the faculty, 8 diplomas to such persons as have satisfactorily completed the 9 required studies of Western Illinois University, and confer 10 such professional and literary degrees as are usually conferred 11 by other institutions of like character for similar or 12 equivalent courses of study, or such as the Board may deem 13 appropriate;

To examine into the conditions, management, 14 and (5) 15 administration of Western Illinois University, to provide the 16 requisite buildings, apparatus, equipment and auxiliary 17 enterprises, and to fix and collect matriculation fees; tuition fees; fees for student activities; fees for student facilities 18 such as student union buildings or field houses or stadia or 19 recreational 20 facilities; other student welfare fees: laboratory fees; and similar fees for supplies and materials. 21 22 The expense of the building, improving, repairing and supplying 23 fuel and furniture and the necessary appliances and apparatus for conducting Western Illinois University, the reimbursed 24 25 expenses of members of the Board, and the salaries or compensation of the President, assistants, agents and other 26

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employees of Western Illinois University, shall be a charge upon the State Treasury. All other expenses shall be chargeable against students, and the Board shall regulate the charges accordingly;

5 (6) To succeed to and to administer all trusts, trust 6 property, and gifts now or hereafter belonging or pertaining to 7 Western Illinois University;

8 (7) To accept endowments of professorships or departments 9 in Western Illinois University from any person who may proffer 10 them and, at regular meetings, to prescribe rules and 11 regulations in relation to endowments and declare on what 12 general principles they may be accepted;

13 (8) To enter into contracts with the Federal government for 14 providing courses of instruction and other services at Western 15 Illinois University for persons serving in or with the military 16 or naval forces of the United States, and to provide such 17 courses of instruction and other services;

18 (9) To contract with respect to the Cooperative Computer 19 Center to obtain services related to electronic data 20 processing;

(10) To provide for the receipt and expenditures of Federal funds paid to Western Illinois University by the Federal government for instruction and other services for persons serving in or with the military or naval forces of the United States, and to provide for audits of such funds;

26 (11) To appoint, subject to the applicable civil service

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law, persons to be members of the Western Illinois University 1 2 Police Department. Members of the Police Department shall be 3 conservators of the peace and as such have all powers possessed by policemen in cities, and sheriffs, including the power to 4 5 make arrests on view or warrants of violations of State statutes, University rules and regulations and city or county 6 7 ordinances, except that they may exercise such powers only 8 within counties wherein Western Illinois University and any of 9 its branches or properties are located when such is required 10 for the protection of University properties and interests, and 11 its students and personnel, and otherwise, within such 12 counties, when requested by appropriate State or local law 13 enforcement officials. However, such officers shall have no 14 power to serve and execute civil processes.

15 The Board must authorize to each member of the Western 16 Illinois University Police Department and to any other employee 17 of Western Illinois University exercising the powers of a peace 18 officer a distinct badge that, on its face, (i) clearly states 19 that the badge is authorized by Western Illinois University and 20 (ii) contains a unique identifying number. No other badge shall 21 be authorized by Western Illinois University;

(12) The Board may, directly or in cooperation with other institutions of higher education, acquire by purchase or lease or otherwise, and construct, enlarge, improve, equip, complete, operate, control and manage research and high technology parks, together with the necessary lands, HB5678 Engrossed - 7 - LRB098 18550 NHT 53688 b

1 buildings, facilities, equipment, and personal property 2 therefor, to encourage and facilitate (i) the location and development of business and industry in the State of Illinois, 3 the increased application and development 4 and (ii) of 5 technology, and (iii) the improvement and development of the 6 State's economy. The Board may lease to nonprofit corporations 7 all or any part of the land, buildings, facilities, equipment 8 or other property included in a research and high technology 9 park upon such terms and conditions as the Board may deem 10 advisable and enter into any contract or agreement with such 11 nonprofit corporations as may be necessary or suitable for the 12 construction, financing, operation and maintenance and 13 management of any such park; and may lease to any person, firm, 14 partnership or corporation, either public or private, any part 15 or all of the land, building, facilities, equipment or other 16 property of such park for such purposes and upon such rentals, 17 terms and conditions as the Board may deem advisable; and may finance all or part of the cost of any such park, including the 18 19 purchase, lease, construction, reconstruction, improvement, 20 remodeling, addition to, and extension and maintenance of all 21 or part of such high technology park, and all equipment and 22 furnishings, by legislative appropriations, government grants, 23 contracts, private gifts, loans, receipts from the operation of such high technology park, rentals and similar receipts; and 24 25 may make its other facilities and services available to tenants 26 or other occupants of any such park at rates which are HB5678 Engrossed - 8 - LRB098 18550 NHT 53688 b

1 reasonable and appropriate;

2 (13) To borrow money, as necessary, from time to time in 3 anticipation of receiving tuition, payments from the State of Illinois, or other revenues or receipts of the University, also 4 5 known as anticipated moneys. The borrowing limit shall be capped at 100% of the total amount of payroll and other expense 6 7 vouchers submitted and payable to the University for fiscal year 2010 expenses, but unpaid by the State Comptroller's 8 9 office. Prior to borrowing any funds, the University shall request from the Comptroller's office a verification of the 10 11 borrowing limit and shall include the estimated date on which 12 such borrowing shall occur. The borrowing limit cap shall be 13 verified by the State Comptroller's office not prior to 45 days 14 before any estimated date for executing any promissory note or 15 line of credit established under this item (13). The principal 16 amount borrowed under a promissory note or line of credit shall 17 not exceed 75% of the borrowing limit. Within 15 days after borrowing funds under any promissory note or line of credit 18 established under this item (13), the University shall submit 19 20 to the Governor's Office of Management and Budget, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the Minority Leader of the 21 22 House of Representatives, the President of the Senate, and the 23 Minority Leader of the Senate an Emergency Short Term Cash 24 Management Plan. 1 Comptroller's office, University's plan and the for 2 expenditure of any borrowed funds, including, but not limited to, a detailed plan to meet payroll obligations to include 3 collective bargaining employees, civil service employees, and 4 5 academic, research, and health care personnel. The 6 establishment of any promissory note or line of credit 7 established under this item (13) must be finalized within 90 days after the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 8 9 96th General Assembly. The borrowed moneys shall be applied to 10 the purposes of paying salaries and other expenses lawfully 11 authorized in the University's State appropriation and unpaid 12 by the State Comptroller. Any line of credit established under 13 this item (13) shall be paid in full one year after creation or within 10 days after the date the University receives 14 15 reimbursement from the State for all submitted fiscal year 2010 16 vouchers, whichever is earlier. Any promissory note 17 established under this item (13) shall be repaid within one year after issuance of the note. The Chairman, Comptroller, or 18 Treasurer of the Board shall execute a promissory note or 19 20 similar debt instrument to evidence the indebtedness incurred by the borrowing. In connection with a borrowing, the Board may 21 22 establish a line of credit with a financial institution, 23 investment bank, or broker/dealer. The obligation to make the 24 payments due under any promissory note or line of credit 25 established under this item (13) shall be a lawful obligation 26 of the University payable from the anticipated moneys. Any

borrowing under this item (13) shall not constitute a debt, 1 2 legal or moral, of the State and shall not be enforceable 3 against the State. The promissory note or line of credit shall be authorized by a resolution passed by the Board and shall be 4 5 valid whether or not a budgeted item with respect to that resolution is included in any annual or supplemental budget 6 adopted by the Board. The resolution shall set forth facts 7 8 demonstrating the need for the borrowing, state an amount that 9 the amount to be borrowed will not exceed, and establish a 10 maximum interest rate limit not to exceed the maximum rate 11 authorized by the Bond Authorization Act or 9%, whichever is 12 less. The resolution may direct the Comptroller or Treasurer of 13 the Board to make arrangements to set apart and hold the portion of the anticipated moneys, as received, that shall be 14 used to repay the borrowing, subject to any prior pledges or 15 16 restrictions with respect to the anticipated moneys. The 17 resolution may also authorize the Treasurer of the Board to make partial repayments of the borrowing as the anticipated 18 19 moneys become available and may contain any other terms, 20 restrictions, or limitations not inconsistent with the powers of the Board. 21

3 (14) To assist in the provision of lands, buildings, and facilities that are supportive of University purposes and 4 5 suitable and appropriate for the conduct and operation of the University's education programs, the Board may exercise the 6 7 following powers with regard to that part of the Southeast Quarter of Section 11, Township 17 North, Range 1 West of the 8 9 4th Principal Meridian, the boundary which is described as 10 follows:

8	(C) Revenues from the development fund account may be

12 work; lease and lease purchase arrangements and the 13 professional services associated with planning and 14 development; surface and structure parking; sidewalks, recreational paths, and street construction; utility 15 16 infrastructure; historic preservation; and building 17 rehabilitation. Money from the development fund account used for any other purpose must be deposited into and 18 19 appropriated from the General Revenue Fund. Buildings or facilities leased to an entity or person other than the 20 21 University are not subject to any limitations applicable to 22 a State-supported college or university under any law. All 23 development on the land and all use of any buildings or 24 facilities is subject to the control and approval of the 25 Board.
