SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

Reduces the FY2014 appropriation to the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority for grants and administrative expenses associated with community-based violence prevention programs from \$15,000,000 to \$3,000,000; after school programs from \$10,000,000 to \$350,000; and the Chicago Area Project from \$5,000,000 to \$2,100,000. Effective immediately.

1 AN ACT making appropriations.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- 4 Section 5. "An Act making appropriations", Public Act 98-
- 5 50, approved July 2, 2013, is amended by changing Sections
- 6 95, 100, and 105 to Article 6 as follows:
