SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

Makes appropriations and reappropriations for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2014.

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1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

4 ARTICLE 0.5

Section 1. It is the intent of the State that all or a 5 portion of the costs of projects funded by appropriations 6 7 made in this Act from the Capital Development Fund, 8 School Construction Fund, the Anti-Pollution Fund, 9 Transportation Bond Series A Fund, the Transportation Bond 10 Series B Fund, the Coal Development Fund, the Transportation 11 Bond Series D Fund, and the Build Illinois Bond Fund will be 12 paid or reimbursed from the proceeds of tax-exempt bonds 13 subsequently issued by the State.

14 ARTICLE 1

15 ARCHITECT OF THE CAPITOL

Section 5. The amount of \$3,883, or so much of thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended on June 30, 2014, from a reappropriation heretofore made for such purpose in Section 5 of Article 25 of Public Act 98-0050, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund to the
