5 "ARTICLE 1

6 Help America Vote Act8,900,000

7 For the implementation of the Statewide
8 Voter Registration System as required by
9 Section 1A-25 of the Illinois Election
10 Code, including maintenance of the
11 IDEA/VISTA program600,000

12 For administrative costs and discretionary
13 grants to Local Election Authorities
14 under Section 101 of the Help America
15 Vote Act1,500,000
