- WHEREAS, Despite current safety laws, more than 4,000,000 workers are injured and thousands of workers are killed due to job hazards each year; and
- WHEREAS, On April 28, 2014 organized labor will observe
  Workers' Memorial Day all across the country to remember those
  who have suffered and died on the job and to renew the fight
  for safe workplaces for all workers; therefore, be it
- 14 RESOLVED, HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES BY THE 15 NINETY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we recognize that as long as there are workers seriously 16 injured or killed on the job, there will be a need to support 17 18 stronger safety and health laws in our State and country and 19 will work to that end; and be it further
