2	AMENDMENT NO Amend Senate Bill 1354, AS AMENDED,
3	by replacing everything after the enacting clause with the
4	following:
5	"Section 5. The Illinois Horse Racing Act of 1975 is
6	amended by adding Section 12.2 as follows:
7	(230 ILCS 5/12.2 new)
8	Sec. 12.2. Business enterprise program.
9	(a) For the purposes of this Section, the terms "minority",
10	"minority owned business", "female", "female owned business",
11	"person with a disability", and "business owned by a person
12	with a disability" have the meaning ascribed to them in the
13	Business Enterprise for Minorities, Females, and Persons with
14	Disabilities Act.
15	(b) The Board shall, by rule, establish goals for the award
16	of contracts by each organization licensee or inter-track

1 wagering licensee to businesses owned by minorities, females, and persons with disabilities, expressed as percentages of an 2 organization licensee's or inter-track wagering licensee's 3 4 total dollar amount of contracts awarded during each calendar 5 year. Each organization licensee or inter-track wagering licensee must make every effort to meet the goals established 6 by the Board pursuant to this Section. When setting the goals 7 for the award of contracts, the Board shall not include 8 9 contracts where: (1) licensees are purchasing goods or services 10 from vendors or suppliers or in markets where there are no or a 11 limited number of minority owned businesses, women owned businesses, or businesses owned by persons with disabilities 12 13 that would be sufficient to satisfy the goal; (2) there are no 14 suppliers licensed by the Board; (3) the licensee or its parent 15 company owns a company that provides the goods or services; or 16 (4) the goods or services are provided to the licensee by a 17 publicly traded company. (c) Each organization licensee or inter-track wagering 18 19 licensee shall file with the Board an annual report of its 20 utilization of minority owned businesses, female owned 21 businesses, and businesses owned by persons with disabilities 22 during the preceding calendar year. The reports shall include a

The Board shall grant the waiver 2 where the organization licensee or inter-track wagering 3 4 licensee demonstrates that there has been made a good faith 5 effort to comply with the goals for participation by minority owned businesses, female owned businesses, and businesses 6 7 owned by persons with disabilities. 8 (e) If the Board determines that its goals and policies are 9 not being met by any organization licensee or inter-track 10 wagering licensee, then the Board may: 11 (1) adopt remedies for such violations; and (2) recommend that the organization licensee or 12 13 inter-track wagering licensee provide additional 14 opportunities for participation by minority owned 15 businesses, female owned businesses, and businesses owned by persons with disabilities; such recommendations may 16 17 include, but shall not be limited to: (A) assurances of stronger and better focused 18 19 solicitation efforts to obtain more minority owned 20 businesses, female owned businesses, and businesses 21 owned by persons with disabilities as potential 22 sources of supply; 23 (B) division of job or project requirements, when 24 economically feasible, into tasks or quantities to 25 permit participation of minority owned businesses, female owned businesses, and businesses owned by 26

1	persons with disabilities;
2	(C) elimination of extended experience or
3	capitalization requirements, when programmatically
4	feasible, to permit participation of minority owned
5	businesses, female owned businesses, and businesses
6	owned by persons with disabilities;
7	(D) identification of specific proposed contracts
8	as particularly attractive or appropriate for
9	participation by minority owned businesses, female
10	owned businesses, and businesses owned by persons with
11	disabilities, such identification to result from and
12	be coupled with the efforts of items (A) through (C);

14	(E) implementation of regulations established for
15	the use of the sheltered market process.
16	(f) The Board shall file, no later than March 1 of each

6	(4) an analysis of the number of minority owned
7	businesses, female owned businesses, and businesses owned
8	by persons with disabilities that are certified under the
9	program as well as the number of those businesses that
10	received State procurement contracts; and
11	(5) a summary of the number of contracts awarded to
12	businesses with annual gross sales of less than \$1,000,000;
13	of \$1,000,000 or more, but less than \$5,000,000; of
14	\$5,000,000 or more, but less than \$10,000,000; and of
15	\$10,000,000 or more.
16	Section 10. The Riverboat Gambling Act is amended by adding
17	Section 7.6 as follows:
18	(230 ILCS 10/7.6 new)
19	Sec. 7.6. Business enterprise program.
20	(a) For the purposes of this Section, the terms "minority",
21	"minority owned business", "female", "female owned business",
22	"person with a disability", and "business owned by a person
23	with a disability" have the meaning ascribed to them in the
24	Business Enterprise for Minorities, Females, and Persons with

1 <u>Disabilities Act.</u>

(b) The Board shall, by rule, establish goals for the award 2 3 of contracts by each owners licensee to businesses owned by 4 minorities, females, and persons with disabilities, expressed 5 as percentages of an owners licensee's total dollar amount of 6 contracts awarded during each calendar year. Each owners licensee must make every effort to meet the goals established 7 by the Board pursuant to this Section. When setting the goals 8 9 for the award of contracts, the Board shall not include 10 contracts where: (1) any purchasing mandates would be dependent 11 upon the availability of minority owned businesses, female owned businesses, and businesses owned by persons with 12 13 disabilities ready, willing, and able with capacity to provide 14 quality goods and services to a gaming operation at reasonable 15 prices; (2) there are no licensed suppliers as defined by this 16 Act for the goods or services provided to the licensee; (3) the licensee or its parent company owns a company that provides the 17 goods or services; or (4) the goods or services are provided to 18 19 the licensee by a publicly traded company.

20 (c) Each owners licensee shall file with the Board an
21 annual report of its utilization of minority owned businesses,
22 female owned businesses, and businesses owned by persons with
23 disabilities during the preceding calendar year. The reports
24 shall include a self-evaluation of the efforts of the owners
25 licensee to meet its goals under this Section.
26 (d) The owners licensee shall have the right to request a

1	waiver from the requirements of this Section. The Board shall
2	grant the waiver where the owners licensee demonstrates that
3	there has been made a good faith effort to comply with the
4	goals for participation by minority owned businesses, female
5	owned businesses, and businesses owned by persons with
6	disabilities.
7	(e) If the Board determines that its goals and policies are
8	not being met by any owners licensee, then the Board may:
9	(1) adopt remedies for such violations; and
10	(2) recommend that the owners licensee provide
11	additional opportunities for participation by minority
12	owned businesses, female owned businesses, and businesses
13	owned by persons with disabilities; such recommendations
14	may include, but shall not be limited to:
15	(A) assurances of stronger and better focused
16	solicitation efforts to obtain more minority owned
17	businesses, female owned businesses, and businesses
18	owned by persons with disabilities as potential
19	sources of supply;
20	(B) division of job or project requirements, when
21	economically feasible, into tasks or quantities to
22	permit participation of minority owned businesses,
23	female owned businesses, and businesses owned by
24	persons with disabilities;
25	(C) elimination of extended experience or
26	capitalization requirements, when programmatically

feasible, to permit participation of minority owned 1 2 businesses, female owned businesses, and businesses 3 owned by persons with disabilities; 4 (D) identification of specific proposed contracts 5 as particularly attractive or appropriate for participation by minority owned businesses, female 6 owned businesses, and businesses owned by persons with 7 8 disabilities, such identification to result from and 9 be coupled with the efforts of items (A) through (C); 10 and (E) implementation of regulations established for 11 12 the use of the sheltered market process. 13 (f) The Board shall file, no later than March 1 of each 14 year, an annual report that shall detail the level of 15 achievement toward the goals specified in this Section over the 3 most recent fiscal years. The annual report shall include, 16 17 but need not be limited to: (1) a summary detailing expenditures subject to the 18 goals, the actual goals specified, and the goals attained 19 20 by each owners licensee; and (2) an analysis of the level of overall goal 21 achievement concerning purchases from minority owned 22 businesses, female owned businesses, and businesses owned 23 24 by persons with disabilities.

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Section 15. The Video Gaming Act is amended by adding

1 Section 28 as follows:

2 (230 ILCS 40/28 new) 3 Sec. 28. Business enterprise program. 4 (a) For the purposes of this Section, the terms "minority", "minority owned business", "female", "female owned business", 5 "person with a disability", and "business owned by a person 6 with a disability" have the meaning ascribed to them in the 7 8 Business Enterprise for Minorities, Females, and Persons with 9 Disabilities Act. 10 (b) The Board shall, by rule, establish goals for the award of contracts by each licensed establishment, licensed 11 fraternal establishment, licensed veterans establishment, or 12 13 terminal operator to businesses owned by minorities, females, 14 and persons with disabilities, expressed as percentages of a licensed establishment's, licensed fraternal establishment's, 15 licensed veterans establishment's, or terminal operator's 16 total dollar amount of contracts awarded during each calendar 17 18 year. Each licensed establishment, licensed fraternal 19 establishment, licensed veterans establishment, or terminal 20 operator must make every effort to meet the goals established 21 by the Board pursuant to this Section. When setting the goals for the award of contracts, the Board shall not include 22 contracts where: (1) licensees are purchasing goods or services 23 24 from vendors or suppliers or in markets where there are no or a 25 limited number of minority owned businesses, women owned

1 businesses, or businesses owned by persons with disabilities that would be sufficient to satisfy the goal; (2) the licensee 2 or its parent company owns a company that provides goods or 3 4 services; or (3) the goods and services are provided to the 5 license by a publicly traded company.

6 (c) Each licensed establishment, licensed fraternal establishment, licensed veterans establishment, or terminal 7 operator shall file with the Board an annual report of its 8 utilization of minority owned businesses, female owned 9 10 businesses, and businesses owned by persons with disabilities 11 during the preceding calendar year. The reports shall include a self-evaluation of the efforts of the licensed establishment, 12 13 licensed fraternal establishment, licensed veterans 14 establishment, or terminal operator to meet its goals under 15 this Section.

16 The licensed establishment, licensed fraternal (d) establishment, licensed veterans establishment, or terminal 17 operator shall have the right to request a waiver from the 18 requirements of this Section. The Board shall grant the waiver 19 20 where the licensed establishment, licensed fraternal establishment, licensed veterans establishment, or terminal 21 22 operator demonstrates that there has been made a good faith effort to comply with the goals for participation by minority 23 24 owned businesses, female owned businesses, and businesses 25 owned by persons with disabilities.

26 (e) If the Board determines that its goals and policies are

not being met by any licensed establishment, licensed fraternal 1 establishment, licensed veterans establishment, or terminal 2 3 operator, then the Board may: 4 (1) adopt remedies for such violations; and 5 (2) recommend that the licensed establishment, licensed fraternal establishment, licensed veterans 6 establishment, or terminal operator provide additional 7 opportunities for participation by minority owned 8 9 businesses, female owned businesses, and businesses owned 10 by persons with disabilities; such recommendations may include, but shall not be limited to: 11 12 (A) assurances of stronger and better focused solicitation efforts to obtain more minority owned 13 14 businesses, female owned businesses, and businesses 15 owned by persons with disabilities as potential 16 sources of supply; 17 (B) division of job or project requirements, when economically feasible, into tasks or quantities to 18 permit participation of minority owned businesses, 19 20 female owned businesses, and businesses owned by 21 persons with disabilities; (C) elimination of extended experience or 22 capitalization requirements, when programmatically 23 24 feasible, to permit participation of minority owned 25 businesses, female owned businesses, and businesses 26 owned by persons with disabilities;

1	(D) identification of specific proposed contracts
2	as particularly attractive or appropriate for
3	participation by minority owned businesses, female
4	owned businesses, and businesses owned by persons with
5	disabilities, such identification to result from and
6	be coupled with the efforts of items (A) through (C);
7	and
8	(E) implementation of regulations established for
9	the use of the sheltered market process.
10	(f) The Board shall file, no later than March 1 of each

26	businesses, female owned businesses, and businesses owned

1	by persons with disabilities;
2	(4) an analysis of the number of minority owned
3	businesses, female owned businesses, and businesses owned
4	by persons with disabilities that are certified under the
5	program as well as the number of those businesses that
6	received State procurement contracts; and
7	(5) a summary of the number of contracts awarded to
8	businesses with annual gross sales of less than \$1,000,000;
9	of \$1,000,000 or more, but less than \$5,000,000; of
10	\$5,000,000 or more, but less than \$10,000,000; and of
11	\$10,000,000 or more.

12 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon 13 becoming law.".
