### SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

75 ILCS 5/5-5 75 ILCS 16/40-45 from Ch. 81, par. 5-5

Amends the Illinois Local Library Act and the Public Library District Act of 1991. Provides that libraries are not required to accept the lowest contract bid for certain projects when the cost is in excess of \$20,000 if the bid does not meet the library's established specifications, terms of delivery, quality, and serviceability requirements. Sets forth the types of contracts that are not subject to competitive bidding. Exempts emergency expenditures from competitive bidding when the emergency expenditure is approved by 3/4 of the members of the board.

# 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Illinois Local Library Act is amended by 5 changing Section 5-5 as follows:

6 (75 ILCS 5/5-5) (from Ch. 81, par. 5-5)

7 Sec. 5-5. When the board determines directors determine to commence the construction of the building or the remodeling, 8 9 repairing or improving of an existing library building or the 10 erection of an addition thereto, the purchase of the necessary equipment for such library, or the acquisition of library 11 12 materials such as books, periodicals, recordings and electronic data storage and retrieval facilities in connection 13 14 with either the purchase or construction of a new library building or the expansion of an existing library building, they 15 16 may then revise the plan therefor or adopt a new plan and 17 provide estimates of the costs thereof, and shall, when the cost is in excess of \$20,000, advertise for bids for the 18 19 construction of the building, or the remodeling, repairing or improving of an existing library building or the erection of an 20 21 addition thereto, or the purchase of the necessary equipment 22 for such library, or the acquisition of library materials such as books, periodicals, recordings and electronic data storage 23

and retrieval facilities in connection with either the purchase or construction of a new library building or the expansion of an existing library building, and shall let the contract or contracts for the same, when the cost is in excess of \$20,000, to the lowest responsible bidder or bidders.

6 <u>The board shall not be required to accept a bid that does</u> 7 <u>not meet the library's established specifications, terms of</u> 8 <u>delivery, quality, and serviceability requirements. Contracts</u> 9 <u>which, by their nature, are not adapted to award by competitive</u> 10 <u>bidding, are not subject to competitive bidding, including, but</u> 11 not limited to:

12 <u>(1) contracts for the services of individuals</u> 13 <u>possessing a high degree of professional skill where the</u> 14 <u>ability or fitness of the individual plays an important</u> 15 <u>part;</u>

16 (2) contracts for the printing of finance committee
17 reports and departmental reports;

18 (3) contracts for the printing or engraving of bonds,
 19 tax warrants and other evidences of indebtedness;

20 <u>(4) contracts for the maintenance or servicing of, or</u> 21 provision of repair parts for, equipment which are made 22 with the manufacturer or authorized service agent of that 23 equipment where the provision of parts, maintenance, or 24 servicing can best be performed by the manufacturer or 25 authorized service agent;

26 (5) purchases and contracts for the use, purchase,

1	delivery, movement, or installation of data processing
2	equipment, software, or services and telecommunications
3	and interconnect equipment, software, and services;
4	(6) contracts for duplicating machines and supplies;
5	(7) contracts for utility services such as water,
6	light, heat, telephone or telegraph;
7	(8) contracts for goods or services procured from
8	another governmental agency;
9	(9) purchases of equipment previously owned by some
10	entity other than the library itself; and
11	(10) contracts for goods or services which are
12	economically procurable from only one source, such as for
13	the purchase of magazines, books, periodicals, pamphlets
14	and reports.
15	Contracts for emergency expenditures are also exempt from
16	competitive bidding when the emergency expenditure is approved
17	by 3/4 of the members of the board.
18	<u>The board shall</u> and may require from such bidders, such
19	security for the performance of the bids $\underline{determined \ by} \ \underline{as}$ the
20	board <u>pursuant to law</u> <del>shall determine</del> . The <u>board</u> <del>directors</del> may
21	let the contract or contracts to one or more bidders, as they
22	shall determine.

24 Section 10. The Public Library District Act of 1991 is 25 amended by changing Section 40-45 as follows:

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(75 ILCS 16/40-45)

Sec. 40-45. Bids for construction, improvements, or
equipment purchases.

4 (a) When the trustees determine to commence constructing 5 the building, purchasing a site or a building, remodeling, 6 repairing, or improving an existing library building, erecting 7 an addition to an existing library building, or purchasing the 8 necessary equipment for the library, they may then revise the 9 plan or adopt a new plan and provide estimates of the costs of 10 the revised or new plan.

11 (b) The board shall, when the cost is in excess of \$20,000, 12 advertise for bids for constructing the building, remodeling, 13 repairing, or improving of an existing library building, erecting an addition to an existing library building, or 14 15 purchasing the necessary equipment for the library and shall 16 let the contract or contracts for the project, when the cost is in excess of \$20,000, to the lowest responsible bidder or 17 18 bidders. The board shall not be required to accept a bid that does not meet the library's established specifications, terms 19 20 of delivery, quality, and serviceability requirements. 21 Contracts which, by their nature, are not adapted to award by 22 competitive bidding, are not subject to competitive bidding, 23 including, but not limited to:

24(1) contracts for the services of individuals25possessing a high degree of professional skill where the

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# 2 <u>Contracts for emergency expenditures are also exempt from</u> 3 <u>competitive bidding when the emergency expenditure is approved</u> 4 <u>by 3/4 of the members of the board.</u>

5 The board shall require from the bidders security for the 6 performance of the bids determined by the board pursuant to 7 law. The trustees may let the contract or contracts to one or 8 more bidders as they determine.
