## 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Boat Registration and Safety Act is amended
  by changing Section 5-18 as follows:
- 6 (625 ILCS 45/5-18) (from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 315-13)
- 7 Sec. 5-18.

8 <u>(a) Beginning on January 1, 2016, no person born on or</u> 9 <u>after January 1, 1991, unless exempted by subsection (i), shall</u> 10 <u>operate a motorboat with over 10 horse power unless that person</u> 11 <u>has a valid Boating Safety Certificate issued by the Department</u> 12 <u>of Natural Resources or an entity or organization recognized</u> 13 <u>and approved by the Department.</u>

14 <u>(b)</u> No person under 10 years of age may operate a 15 motorboat.

(c) Prior to January 1, 2016, persons Persons at least 10 16 17 years of age and less than 12 years of age may operate a motorboat with over 10 horse power only if they are accompanied 18 19 on the motorboat and under the direct control of a parent or 20 guardian or a person at least 18 years of age designated by a 21 parent or guardian. Beginning on January 1, 2016, persons at 22 least 10 years of age and less than 12 years of age may operate a motorboat with over 10 horse power only if the person is 23

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1 <u>under the direct on-board supervision of a parent or guardian</u>
2 who meets the requirements of subsection (a) or a person at
3 <u>least 18 years of age who meets the requirements of subsection</u>
4 (a) and is designated by a parent or guardian.

5 (d) Prior to January 1, 2016, persons Persons at least 12 years of age and less than 18 years of age may operate a 6 motorboat with over 10 horse power only if they are accompanied 7 on the motorboat and under the direct control of a parent or 8 9 guardian or a person at least 18 years of age designated by a 10 parent or quardian, or the such motorboat operator is in 11 possession of a Boating Safety Certificate issued by the 12 Department of Natural Resources, Division of Law Enforcement, 13 authorizing the holder to operate motorboats. Beginning on 14 January 1, 2016, persons at least 12 years and less than 18 years of age may operate a motorboat with over 10 horse power 15 16 only if the person meets the requirements of subsection (a) or 17 is under the direct on-board supervision of a parent or quardian who meets the requirements of subsection (a) or a 18 19 person at least 18 years of age who meets the requirements of 20 subsection (a) and is designated by a parent or quardian.

(e) Beginning January 1, 2016, the owner of a motorboat or a person given supervisory authority over a motorboat shall not permit a motorboat with over 10 horse power to be operated by a person not possessing a valid Boating Safety Certificate as required by this Section.

26 (f) Licensed boat liveries may offer an abbreviated safety

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course covering core boat safety rules. A person who completes 1 2 an abbreviated safety course may operate a motorboat rented 3 from the livery providing the abbreviated safety course without having a Boating Safety Certificate for up to one year from the 4 5 date of course completion. The Department shall adopt rules to 6 implement this subsection. 7 (q) Violations. 8 (1) A person who is operating a motorboat with over 10 9 horse power and is required to have a valid Boating Safety 10 Certificate under the provisions of this Section shall 11 present the certificate to a law enforcement officer upon

12 request. Failure of the person to present the certificate
13 upon request is a petty offense.

14 (2) A person who provides false or fictitious 15 information in an application for a Boating Safety 16 Certificate; or who alters, forges, counterfeits, or 17 falsifies a Boating Safety Certificate; or who possesses a 18 Boating Safety Certificate that has been altered, forged, 19 counterfeited, or falsified is guilty of a Class A 20 misdemeanor.

<u>(3) A person who loans or permits their Boating Safety</u>
 <u>Certificate to be used by another person; or who operates a</u>
 <u>motorboat with over 10 horse power using a Boating Safety</u>
 <u>Certificate that has not been issued to that person is</u>
 <u>guilty of a Class A misdemeanor.</u>

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(4) Violations of this Section done with the knowledge

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1 2 of a parent or guardian shall be deemed a violation by the parent or guardian and punishable under Section 11A-1.

3 (h) The Department of Natural Resources, Division of Law Enforcement, shall establish a program of instruction on 4 5 boating safety, laws, regulations and administrative laws, and any other subject matter which might be related to the subject 6 7 of general boat safety. The program shall be conducted by 8 instructors certified by the Department of Natural Resources, 9 Division of Law Enforcement. The course of instruction for 10 persons certified to teach boating safety shall be not less 11 than 8 hours in length, and the Department shall have the 12 authority to revoke the certification of any instructor who has 13 demonstrated his inability to conduct courses on the subject 14 matter. The Department of Natural Resources shall develop and provide a method for students to complete the program online. 15 16 Students satisfactorily completing a program of not less than 8 17 hours in length shall receive a certificate of safety from the Department of Natural Resources, Division of Law Enforcement. 18 19 The Department may cooperate with schools, online vendors, private clubs and other organizations in offering boating 20 safety courses throughout the State of Illinois. 21

The Department shall issue certificates of boating safety to persons 10 years of age or older successfully completing the prescribed course of instruction and passing such tests as may be prescribed by the Department. exceed \$5. If a fee is authorized by the Department, the Department shall authorize instructors conducting such courses meeting standards established by it to charge for the rental of facilities or for the cost of materials utilized in the course. Fees retained by the Department shall be utilized to defray a part of its expenses to operate the safety and accident reporting programs of the Department.

8 (i) A Boating Safety Certificate is not required by:

9 <u>(1) a person who possesses a valid United States Coast</u> 10 <u>Guard commercial vessel operator's license or a marine</u> 11 <u>certificate issued by the Canadian government;</u>

(2) a person employed by the United States, this State,
 another state, or a subdivision thereof while in
 performance of his or her official duties;

15 <u>(3) a person that is not a resident, is temporarily</u> 16 <u>using the waters of this State for a period not to exceed</u> 17 <u>90 days, and meets any applicable boating safety education</u> 18 <u>requirements of his or her state of residency or possesses</u> 19 <u>a Canadian Pleasure Craft Operator's Card;</u>

20 <u>(4) a person that has assumed operation of the</u> 21 <u>motorboat due to the illness or physical impairment of the</u> 22 <u>operator, and is returning the motorboat or personal</u> 23 <u>watercraft to shore in order to provide assistance or care</u> 24 <u>for that operator;</u>

25(5) a person that is registered as a commercial26fisherman or a person who is under the onboard direct

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- 1 <u>supervision of the commercial fisherman while operating</u>
  2 the commercial fisherman's vessel;
- 3 (6) a person that is serving or has qualified as a
  4 surface warfare officer or enlisted surface warfare
  5 specialist in the United States Navy;

6 <u>(7) a person that has assumed operation of the</u> 7 <u>motorboat for the purpose of completing a watercraft safety</u> 8 <u>course approved by the Department, the U.S. Coast Guard, or</u> 9 <u>the National Association of State Boating Law</u> 10 <u>Administrators; or</u>

11 (8) a A person over the age of 12 years who holds a 12 valid certificate issued by another state, a province of 13 the Dominion of Canada, the United States Coast Guard 14 Auxiliary or the United States Power Squadron need not 15 obtain a certificate from the Department if the course 16 content of the program in such other state, province or 17 organization substantially meets that established by the Department under this Section. A certificate issued by the 18 19 Department or by another state, province of the Dominion of 20 Canada or approved organization shall not constitute an operator's license, but shall certify only that the student 21 22 successfully passed a course in boating safety has 23 instruction.

<u>(j)</u> The Department of Natural Resources, Division of Law
 Enforcement, shall adopt rules necessary to implement and
 enforce the provisions of this Section. <u>The Department of</u>

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- 1 <u>Natural Resources shall consult and coordinate with the boating</u>
- 2 public, professional organizations for recreational boating
- 3 safety, and the boating retail, leasing, and dealer business
- 4 <u>community in the adoption of these rules.</u>
