1 AMENDMENT TO HOUSE BILL 403

2 AMENDMENT NO. _____. Amend House Bill 403 by replacing
3 everything after the enacting clause with the following:

4 "Section 5. The University of Illinois Act is amended by
5 changing Section 7f as follows:

6 (110 ILCS 305/7f) (from Ch. 144, par. 28f)

7 Sec. 7f. Partial tuition waivers.

8 (a) As used in this Section, "Illinois college or
9 university" means any of the following: the University of
10 Illinois, Southern Illinois University, Chicago State
11 University, Eastern Illinois University, Governors State
12 University, Illinois State University, Northeastern Illinois
13 University, Northern Illinois University, and Western Illinois
14 University.

15 (b) Each year the Board of Trustees of the University of
16 Illinois shall offer 50% tuition waivers for undergraduate

1 education at any campus under its governance or supervision to
2 the children of employees of an Illinois college or university
3 who have been employed by any one or by more than one Illinois
4 college or university for an aggregate period of at least 7
5 years. However, no waivers may be offered under this Section to
6 students enrolled at the University of Illinois after the
7 2015-2016 academic year, although renewals shall be permitted
8 under subsection (c) of this Section. To be eligible to receive
9 a partial tuition waiver, the child of an employee of an
10 Illinois college or university (i) must be under the age of 25
11 at the commencement of the academic year during which the
12 partial tuition waiver is to be effective, and (ii) must
13 qualify for admission to the University of Illinois under the
14 same admissions requirements, standards and policies which the
15 University of Illinois applies to applicants for admission
16 generally to its respective undergraduate colleges and
17 programs.

18 (c) Subject to the provisions and limitations of subsection
19 (b), an eligible applicant who has continued to maintain
20 satisfactory academic progress toward graduation may have his
21 or her partial tuition waiver renewed until the time as he or
22 she has expended 4 years of undergraduate partial tuition
23 waiver benefits under this Section.

24 (d) No partial tuition waiver offered or allocated to any
25 eligible applicant in accordance with the provisions of this
26 Section shall be charged against any tuition waiver limitation

1 established by the Illinois Board of Higher Education.

2 (e) The Board of Trustees shall prescribe rules and
3 regulations as are necessary to implement and administer the
4 provisions of this Section.

7 Act is amended by changing Section 8f as follows:

8 (110 ILCS 520/8f) (from Ch. 144, par. 658f)

9 Sec. 8f. Partial tuition waivers.

10 (a) As used in this Section, "Illinois college or
11 university" means any of the following: the University of
12 Illinois, Southern Illinois University, Chicago State
13 University, Eastern Illinois University, Governors State
14 University, Illinois State University, Northeastern Illinois
15 University, Northern Illinois University, and Western Illinois
16 University.

17 (b) Each year the Board of Trustees of Southern Illinois
18 University shall offer 50% tuition waivers for undergraduate
19 education at any campus under its governance or supervision to
20 the children of employees of an Illinois college or university
21 who have been employed by any one or by more than one Illinois
22 college or university for an aggregate period of at least 7
23 years. However, no waivers may be offered under this Section to
24 students enrolled at Southern Illinois University after the

1 2015-2016 academic year, although renewals shall be permitted
2 under subsection (c) of this Section. To be eligible to receive
3 a partial tuition waiver, the child of an employee of an
4 Illinois college or university (i) must be under the age of 25
5 at the commencement of the academic year during which the
6 partial tuition waiver is to be effective, and (ii) must
7 qualify for admission to Southern Illinois University under the
8 same admissions requirements, standards and policies which
9 Southern Illinois University applies to applicants for

8 University, Eastern Illinois University, Governors State
9 University, Illinois State University, Northeastern Illinois
10 University, Northern Illinois University, and Western Illinois
11 University.

12 (b) Each year the Board of Chicago State University shall
13 offer 50% tuition waivers for undergraduate education at any
14 campus under its governance to the children of employees of an
15 Illinois college or university who have been employed by any
16 one or by more than one Illinois college or university for an
17 aggregate period of at least 7 years. However, no waivers may
18 be offered under this Section to students enrolled at Chicago
19 State University after the 2015-2016 academic year, although
20 renewals shall be permitted under subsection (c) of this
21 Section. To be eligible to receive a partial tuition waiver,
22 the child of an employee of an Illinois college or university
23 (i) must be under the age of 25 at the commencement of the
24 academic year during which the partial tuition waiver is to be
25 effective, and (ii) must qualify for admission to Chicago State

1 University under the same admissions requirements, standards
2 and policies which Chicago State University applies to
3 applicants for admission generally to its respective
4 undergraduate colleges and programs.

5 be offered under this Section to students enrolled at Governors
6 State University after the 2015-2016 academic year, although

10 (i) must be under the age of 25 at the commencement of the

23 shall offer 50% tuition waivers for undergraduate education at
24 any campus under its governance to the children of employees of

1 an Illinois college or university who have been employed by any
2 one or by more than one Illinois college or university for an
3 aggregate period of at least 7 years. However, no waivers may
4 be offered under this Section to students enrolled at Western
5 Illinois University after the 2015-2016 academic year,
6 although renewals shall be permitted under subsection (c) of
7 this Section. To be eligible to receive a partial tuition
8 waiver, the child of an employee of an Illinois college or
9 university (i) must be under the age of 25 at the commencement
10 of the academic year during which the partial tuition waiver is
11 to be effective, and (ii) must qualify for admission to Western
12 Illinois University under the same admissions requirements,
13 standards and policies which Western Illinois University
14 applies to applicants for admission generally to its respective
15 undergraduate colleges and programs.
