The studying of this material shall constitute an affirmation by students of their commitment to respect the dignity of all races and peoples and to forever eschew every form of discrimination in their lives and careers. In no event may a student complete the 8th grade or graduate from high school without studying this material.

The State Superintendent of Education may prepare and make 1 2 available to all school boards instructional materials,

including those established by the Amistad Commission, which 3

may be used as guidelines for development of a unit of

5 instruction under this Section; provided, however, that each

6 school board shall itself determine the minimum amount of

7 instruction time which shall qualify as a unit of instruction

8 satisfying the requirements of this Section.
