23	when those leases or subleases will not interfere with State
24	usage of the facility. This authority is meant to supplement
25	and shall not in any way be interpreted to restrict the

Director's ability to make portions of the State of Illinois

Building and the James R. Thompson Center available for long-term commercial leases or subleases.

Notwithstanding the provisions above, the Department of Children and Family Services and the Department of Human Services (as successor to the Department of Rehabilitation Services and the Department of Mental Health and Developmental Disabilities) shall determine the allocation of space for direct recipient care in their respective facilities. The Department of Central Management Services shall consult with the affected agency in the allocation and lease of surplus space in these facilities. Potential lease arrangements shall not endanger the direct recipient care responsibilities in these facilities.

(b) To appoint, subject to the Personnel Code, persons to be members of a police and security force. Members of the security force shall be peace officers when performing duties pursuant to this Section and as such shall have all of the powers possessed by policemen in cities and sheriffs, including the power to make arrests on view or issue citations for violations of State statutes or city or county ordinances, except that in counties of more than 1,000,000 population, any powers created by this subsection shall be exercised only (i) when necessary to protect the property, personnel, or interests of the Department or any State agency for whom the Department manages, operates, or maintains property or (ii) when specifically requested by appropriate State or local law

- 1 enforcement officials, and except that within counties of
- 1,000,000 or less population, these powers shall be exercised 2
- 3 only when necessary to protect the property, personnel, or
- 4 interests of the State of Illinois and only while on property
- 5 managed, operated, or maintained by the Department.
- 6 Nothing in this subsection shall be construed so as to make
- it conflict with any provisions of, or rules promulgated under, 7
- 8 the Personnel Code.
- 9 (c) To charge reasonable fees for the lease, rental, use,
- 10 or occupancy of State facilities managed, operated, or
- 11 maintained by the Department. All moneys collected under this
- Section shall be deposited in a revolving fund in the State 12
- 13 treasury known as the Facilities Management Revolving Fund.
- (d) Provisions of this Section relating to the James R. 14
- 15 Thompson Center are subject to the provisions of Section 7.4 of
- 16 the State Property Control Act.
- (e) The use of vapor products, as that term is defined 17
- under Section 10-20.5c of the School Code, is prohibited in the 18
- 19 hallways and common areas within any State governmental
- 20 building except in Illinois Veterans' Homes operated and
- 21 maintained by the Illinois Department of Veterans' Affairs. For
- 22 the purposes of this subsection (e), "State governmental
- building" means a structure owned by the State of Illinois or 23
- 24 any of its agencies or by any State university or college or
- 25 any of its corporate outgrowths thereof.

2 Section 10. The School Code is amended by adding Section

3 10-20.5c as follows:

(105 ILCS 5/10-20.5c new)4

Sec. 10-20.5c. Prohibition of the use of vapor products. Each school board shall prohibit the use of vapor products on school property, including, but not limited to, in or on the grounds of any school, preschool, or day care facility, or at any off-campus school-sponsored or school-sanctioned event, by any school personnel, student, or other person when such property is being used for any school purposes. The school board may not authorize or permit any exception to or exemption from the prohibition at any place or at any time, including without limitation outside of school buildings, before or after the regular school day, or on days when school is not in session. "School purposes" include, but are not limited to, all events or activities or other use of school property that the school board or school officials authorize or permit on school property, including without limitation all interscholastic or extracurricular athletic, academic, or other events sponsored by the school board or in which pupils of the district participate. For purposes of this Section "vapor product" means any non-combustible tobacco-derived product containing nicotine, such as an electronic cigarette, that employs a

- 1 mechanical heating element, battery, or electronic circuit, regardless of shape or size, that can be used to heat a liquid 2 nicotine solution that can be used with or in a vapor product. 3 4 "Vapor product" does not include cigarettes, as that term is 5 defined under Section 1 of the Cigarette Tax Act, and tobacco 6 products, as that term is defined under Section 10-5 of the Tobacco Products Tax Act of 1995. "Vapor product" does not 7 include any asthma inhaler or any product regulated by the 8 9 United States Food and Drug Administration under Chapter V of 10 the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act.
- Section 15. The Board of Higher Education Act is amended by adding Section 20 as follows:
- 13 (110 ILCS 205/20 new)
- Sec. 20. Prohibition of use of vapor products. The use of
 vapor products, as that term is defined in Section 10-20.5c of
 the School Code, shall be prohibited in any dormitory of any
 public or nonpublic institution of higher education. For
 purposes of this Section, "nonpublic institution of higher
 education" has the meaning given to that term in Section 2 of
 the Higher Education Cooperation Act.".
