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1	AMENDMENT TO HOUSE BILL 2658
2	AMENDMENT NO Amend House Bill 2658 by replacing
3	everything after the enacting clause with the following:
4	"Section 5. The State Police Act is amended by adding
5	Section 17b as follows:
6	(20 ILCS 2610/17b new)
7	Sec. 17b. Retiring officer; purchase of service firearm and
8	police badge. The Director of State Police shall establish a
9	program to allow a State Police officer who is honorably
10	retiring in good standing to purchase either or both of the
11	following: (i) any State Police badge previously issued to that
12	officer or (ii) if the officer has a currently valid Firearm
13	Owner's Identification Card, the service firearm issued or
14	previously issued to the officer by the Department of State
15	Police. The cost of the firearm purchased shall be the
16	replacement value of the firearm and not the firearm's fair

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1 market value.

Any officer who retires in good standing is eligible to purchase his or her service pistol and badge as provided in this Section. A good standing separation determination results when there are no pending criminal complaints against the officer which, if sustained, would result in the permanent loss of police powers.

8 Section 10. The State Property Control Act is amended by 9 changing Section 7 as follows:

10 (30 ILCS 605/7) (from Ch. 127, par. 133b10)

11 Sec. 7. Disposition of transferable property.

12 (a) Except as provided in subsection (c), whenever a 13 responsible officer considers it advantageous to the State to 14 dispose of transferable property by trading it in for credit on a replacement of like nature, the responsible officer shall 15 report the trade-in and replacement to the administrator on 16 17 forms furnished by the latter. The exchange, trade or transfer 18 of "textbooks" as defined in Section 18-17 of the School Code 19 between schools or school districts pursuant to regulations adopted by the State Board of Education under that Section 20 21 shall not constitute a disposition of transferable property 22 within the meaning of this Section, even though such exchange, 23 trade or transfer occurs within 5 years after the textbooks are 24 first provided for loan pursuant to Section 18-17 of the School 1 Code.

(b) Except as provided in subsection (c), whenever it is 2 deemed necessary to dispose of any item of transferable 3 4 property, the administrator shall proceed to dispose of the 5 property by sale or scrapping as the case may be, in whatever 6 manner he considers most advantageous and most profitable to Items of transferable property which would 7 State. the 8 ordinarily be scrapped and disposed of by burning or by burial 9 in a landfill may be examined and a determination made whether 10 the property should be recycled. This determination and any 11 sale of recyclable property shall be in accordance with rules promulgated by the Administrator. 12

13 When the administrator determines that property is to be disposed of by sale, he shall offer it first to the 14 15 municipalities, counties, and school districts of the State and 16 to charitable, not-for-profit educational and public health but 17 organizations, including not limited to medical 18 institutions, clinics, hospitals, health centers, schools, 19 colleges, universities, child care centers, museums, nursing 20 homes, programs for the elderly, food banks, State Use 21 Sheltered Workshops and the Boy and Girl Scouts of America, for 22 purchase at an appraised value. Notice of inspection or viewing 23 dates and property lists shall be distributed in the manner 24 provided in rules and regulations promulgated by the 25 Administrator for that purpose.

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Electronic data processing equipment purchased and charged

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1 to appropriations may, at the discretion of the administrator, 2 be sold, pursuant to contracts entered into by the Director of 3 Central Management Services or the heads of agencies exempt 4 from "The Illinois Purchasing Act". However such equipment 5 shall not be sold at prices less than the purchase cost thereof or depreciated value as determined by the administrator. No 6 sale of the electronic data processing equipment and lease to 7 8 the State by the purchaser of such equipment shall be made 9 under this Act unless the Director of Central Management 10 Services finds that such contracts financially are 11 advantageous to the State.

Disposition of other transferable property by sale, except sales directly to local governmental units, school districts, and not-for-profit educational, charitable and public health organizations, shall be subject to the following minimum conditions:

(1) The administrator shall cause the property to be advertised for sale to the highest responsible bidder, stating time, place, and terms of such sale at least 7 days prior to the time of sale and at least once in a newspaper having a general circulation in the county where the property is to be sold.

(2) If no acceptable bids are received, the
 administrator may then sell the property in whatever manner
 he considers most advantageous and most profitable to the
 State.

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1 (c) Notwithstanding any other provision of this Act, an 2 agency covered by this Act may transfer books, serial 3 publications, or other library materials that are transferable 4 property, or that have been withdrawn from the agency's library 5 collection through a regular collection evaluation process, to 6 any of the following entities :

7 (1) Another agency covered by this Act located in8 Illinois.

9 (2) A State supported university library located in 10 Illinois.

11 (3) A tax-supported public library located in 12 Illinois, including a library established by a public 13 library district.

14 (4) A library system organized under the Illinois
15 Library System Act or any library located in Illinois that
16 is a member of such a system.

17 (5) A non-profit agency, located in or outside18 Illinois.

A transfer of property under this subsection is not subjectto the requirements of subsection (a) or (b).

In addition, an agency covered by this Act may sell or exchange books, serial publications, and other library materials that have been withdrawn from its library collection through a regular collection evaluation process. 1 other organizations. Revenues generated from the sale of 2 withdrawn items shall be retained by the agency in a separate 3 account to be used solely for the purchase of library 4 materials; except that in the case of the State Library, 5 revenues from the sale of withdrawn items shall be deposited 6 into the State Library Fund to be used for the purposes stated 7 in Section 25 of the State Library Act.

8 For purposes of this subsection (c), "library materials" 9 means physical entities of any substance that serve as carriers 10 of information, including, without limitation, books, serial 11 publications, periodicals, microforms, graphics, audio or 12 video recordings, and machine readable data files.

13 (d) Notwithstanding any other provision of this Act, the 14 Director of State Police may dispose of a service firearm or 15 police badge issued or previously issued to a retiring State 16 Police officer as provided in Section 17b of the State Police 17 Act.
