# Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

#### 4 ARTICLE 0.5

Section 1. It is the intent of the State that all or a 5 6 portion of the costs of projects funded by appropriations 7 made in this Act from the Capital Development Fund, Fund, the Anti-Pollution Fund, 8 School Construction 9 Transportation Bond Series A Fund, the Transportation Bond 10 Series B Fund, the Coal Development Fund, the Transportation Bond Series D Fund, and the Build Illinois Bond Fund will be 11 12 paid or reimbursed from the proceeds of tax-exempt bonds 13 subsequently issued by the State.

#### 15 ARCHITECT OF THE CAPITOL

Section 5. The amount of \$3,883, or so much thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended on June 30, 2015, from a reappropriation heretofore made for such purpose in Section 5 of Article 1 of Public Act 98-0675, is
