SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

625 ILCS 5/12-201

from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 12-201

Amends the Illinois Vehicle Code. Requires automobiles to at all times exhibit at least 2 lighted head lamps when operated upon any highway in this State. Effective January 1, 2016.

AN ACT concerning transportation.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by changing
Section 12-201 as follows:

6 (625 ILCS 5/12-201) (from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 12-201)

7 Sec. 12-201. When lighted lamps are required.

(a) When operated upon any highway in this State, every 8 9 motorcycle, motor-driven cycle, moped, and low-speed electric bicycle, shall at all times exhibit at least one lighted lamp, 10 showing a white light visible for at least 500 feet in the 11 direction the motorcycle is proceeding. However, in lieu of 12 such lighted lamp, a motorcycle, motor-driven cycle, moped, or 13 14 low-speed electric bicycle may be equipped with and use a means of modulating the upper beam of the head lamp between high and 15 16 a lower brightness. No such head lamp shall be modulated, 17 except to otherwise comply with this Code, during times when lighted lamps are required for other motor vehicles. 18

(b) All other motor vehicles shall <u>at all times</u> exhibit at least 2 lighted head lamps, with at least one on each side of the front of the vehicle, which satisfy United States Department of Transportation requirements, showing white lights, including that emitted by high intensity discharge

(HID) lamps, or lights of a yellow or amber tint, during the 1 2 period from sunset to sunrise, at times when rain, snow, fog, or other atmospheric conditions require the use of windshield 3 wipers, and at any other times when, due to insufficient light 4 5 or unfavorable atmospheric conditions, persons and vehicles on the highway are not clearly discernible at a distance of 1000 6 7 feet. Parking lamps may be used in addition to but not in lieu 8 such head lamps. Every motor vehicle, trailer, of or 9 semi-trailer shall also exhibit at least 2 lighted lamps, 10 commonly known as tail lamps, which shall be mounted on the 11 left rear and right rear of the vehicle so as to throw a red 12 light visible for at least 500 feet in the reverse direction, 13 except that a truck tractor or road tractor manufactured before January 1, 1968 and all motorcycles need be equipped with only 14 15 one such tail lamp.

16 (c) Either a tail lamp or a separate lamp shall be so 17 constructed and placed as to illuminate with a white light a rear registration plate when required and render it clearly 18 legible from a distance of 50 feet to the rear. Any tail lamp 19 20 or tail lamps, together with any separate lamp or lamps for illuminating a rear registration plate, shall be so wired as to 21 be lighted whenever the head lamps or auxiliary driving lamps 22 23 are lighted.

(d) A person shall install only head lamps that satisfy
United States Department of Transportation regulations and
show white light, including that emitted by HID lamps, or light

of a yellow or amber tint for use by a motor vehicle.
