everything after the enacting clause with the following:

AMENDMENT TO HOUSE BILL 3667

- "Section 5. The Illinois Procurement Code is amended by changing Section 25-75 as follows:
- 6 (30 ILCS 500/25-75)
- 7 Sec. 25-75. Purchase of motor vehicles.
- (a) Beginning on the effective date of this amendatory Act 8 of the 94th General Assembly, all gasoline-powered vehicles 9 10 purchased from State funds must be flexible fuel vehicles. 11 July 1, 2007, all gasoline-powered vehicles Beginning purchased from State funds must be flexible fuel or fuel 12 13 efficient hybrid vehicles. For purposes of this Section, "flexible fuel vehicles" are automobiles or light trucks that 14 15 operate on either gasoline or E-85 (85% ethanol, 15% gasoline) fuel and "Fuel efficient hybrid vehicles" are automobiles or 16

- 1 light trucks that use a gasoline or diesel engine and an
- 2 electric motor to provide power and gain at least a 20%
- 3 increase in combined US-EPA city-highway fuel economy over the
- 4 equivalent or most-similar conventionally-powered model.
- 5 (b) On and after the effective date of this amendatory Act
- of the 94th General Assembly, any vehicle purchased from State
- 7 funds that is fueled by diesel fuel shall be certified by the
- 8 manufacturer to run on 5% biodiesel (B5) fuel.
- 9 (b-5) On and after January 1, 2016, 15% 25% of passenger
- 10 vehicles, other than Department of Corrections vehicles,
- 11 Secretary of State vehicles (except for mid-sized sedans), and
- 12 Department of State Police patrol vehicles, purchased with
- 13 State funds shall be vehicles fueled by electricity,
- 14 electricity and gasohol (hybrids or plug-in hybrids),
- 15 compressed natural gas, liquid petroleum gas, or liquid natural
- gas, including dedicated or non-dedicated fuel type vehicles.
- 17 (c) The Chief Procurement Officer may determine that
- 18 certain vehicle procurements are exempt from this Section based
- 19 on intended use or other reasonable considerations such as
- 20 health and safety of Illinois citizens.
