SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

720 ILCS 5/2-13 745 ILCS 22/5 from Ch. 38, par. 2-13

Amends the Criminal Code of 2012. Changes references of various federal law enforcement agencies from their previous names to their current names. Includes in the definition of "peace officer" under the Criminal Code of 2012 for particular purposes: (1) Amtrak Police; (2) Federal Reserve Police; (3) the United States Department of Veterans Affairs Police; and (4) U.S. Probation and Pre-trial Services. Amends the Federal Law Enforcement Officer Immunity Act to make conforming changes.

1 AN ACT concerning federal law enforcement agencies.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Criminal Code of 2012 is amended by changing

 Section 2-13 as follows:
- 6 (720 ILCS 5/2-13) (from Ch. 38, par. 2-13)

Sec. 2-13. "Peace officer". "Peace officer" means (i) any person who by virtue of his office or public employment is vested by law with a duty to maintain public order or to make arrests for offenses, whether that duty extends to all offenses or is limited to specific offenses, or (ii) any person who, by statute, is granted and authorized to exercise powers similar to those conferred upon any peace officer employed by a law enforcement agency of this State.

For purposes of Sections concerning unlawful use of weapons, for the purposes of assisting an Illinois peace officer in an arrest, or when the commission of any offense under Illinois law is directly observed by the person, and statutes involving the false personation of a peace officer, false personation of a peace officer while carrying a deadly weapon, false personation of a peace officer in attempting or committing a felony, and false personation of a peace officer in attempting or attempting or committing a forcible felony, then officers,

3	criminal laws shall be considered "peace officers" under this
4	Code, including, but not limited to all criminal investigators
