1 AN ACT concerning State government.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Military Code of Illinois is amended by adding Section 93.1 as follows:
- 6 (20 ILCS 1805/93.1 new)
- 7 Sec. 93.1. Pre-deployment and post-deployment testing. All 8 members of the Illinois National Guard shall undergo 9 pre-deployment and post-deployment testing for depleted 10 uranium. The Department shall cover the costs associated with such testing. If a federal law requiring pre-deployment and 11 12 post-deployment testing for depleted uranium for members of the National Guard takes effect, then this Section 93.1 shall be 13 14 inoperative on and after the effective date of that federal 15 law.
- Section 10. The Department of Veterans Affairs Act is amended by changing Section 2 as follows:
- 18 (20 ILCS 2805/2) (from Ch. 126 1/2, par. 67)
- 19 Sec. 2. Powers and duties. The Department shall have the 20 following powers and duties:
- To perform such acts at the request of any veteran, or his

- (1) Contact veterans, their survivors and dependents and advise them of the benefits of state and federal laws and assist them in obtaining such benefits;
- (2) Establish field offices and direct the activities of the personnel assigned to such offices;
- (3) Create and maintain a volunteer field force; the volunteer field force may include representatives from the following without limitation: educational institutions, labor organizations, veterans organizations, employers, churches, and farm organizations; the volunteer field force may not process federal veterans assistance claims;
 - (4) Conduct informational and training services;
- (5) Conduct educational programs through newspapers, periodicals, social media, television, and radio for the specific purpose of disseminating information affecting veterans and their dependents;
- (6) Coordinate the services and activities of all state departments having services and resources affecting veterans and their dependents;

- 1 (7) Encourage and assist in the coordination of 2 agencies within counties giving service to veterans and 3 their dependents;
 - (8) Cooperate with veterans organizations and other governmental agencies;
 - (9) Make, alter, amend and promulgate reasonable rules and procedures for the administration of this Act;
 - (10) Make and publish annual reports to the Governor regarding the administration and general operation of the Department;
 - (11) (Blank); and
 - (12) (Blank); and -
 - of Illinois who served on active duty in Afghanistan, Iraq, Kuwait, or Qatar with any component of the U.S. Armed Forces, including the Illinois National Guard, who requests a pre-deployment or post-deployment test for depleted uranium in accessing federal resources for pre-deployment and post-deployment testing for depleted uranium; if a federal law requiring pre-deployment and post-deployment testing for depleted uranium for past and present members of any component of the U.S. Armed Forces takes effect, then this paragraph (13) shall be inoperative on and after the effective date of that federal law.

The Department may accept and hold on behalf of the State,

if for the public interest, a grant, gift, devise or bequest of

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1 money or property to the Department made for the general 2 benefit of Illinois veterans, including the conduct of 3 informational and training services by the Department and other authorized purposes of the Department. The Department shall 5 cause each grant, gift, devise or bequest to be kept as a distinct fund and shall invest such funds in the manner 6 7 provided by the Public Funds Investment Act, as now or 8 hereafter amended, and shall make such reports as may be 9 required by the Comptroller concerning what funds are so held 10 and the manner in which such funds are invested. The Department 11 may make grants from these funds for the general benefit of 12 Illinois veterans. Grants from these funds, except for the 13 funds established under Sections 2.01a and 2.03, shall be 14 subject to appropriation.

The Department has the power to make grants, from funds appropriated from the Korean War Veterans National Museum and Library Fund, to private organizations for the benefit of the Korean War Veterans National Museum and Library.

The Department has the power to make grants, from funds appropriated from the Illinois Military Family Relief Fund, for benefits authorized under the Survivors Compensation Act.
