HOUSE RESOLUTION

2 WHEREAS, Measles is a highly contagious respiratory 3 disease that spreads easily through the air or on infected 4 surfaces; it causes rash, high fever, cough, runny nose, and 5 red watery eyes; people who are infected with measles can 6 spread the virus for up to 4 days before developing symptoms; 7 and

8 WHEREAS, Measles affect all organs of the body, and can 9 cause serious and, in some cases, fatal complications in 10 children, including pneumonia and encephalitis; and

11 WHEREAS, A non-immunized person or child has a 90% chance 12 of getting the measles if they come in contact with an infected 13 person; and

14 WHEREAS, The measles vaccine has been shown in numerous 15 studies to be one of the most safe and effective vaccines 16 available; and

17 WHEREAS, High immunization rates in a community will 18 protect those who cannot be vaccinated, including children undergoing cancer treatment and infants under 12 months of age, 19 highest 20 at the risk of serious illness, who are 21 hospitalization, or death due to measles; and

1 WHEREAS, The American Academy of Pediatrics, the Centers 2 for Disease Control and Prevention, and the American Academy of 3 Family Physicians all recommend that children receive the 4 measles, mumps, and rubella (MMR) vaccine at the age of 12-15 5 months, and again at 4-6 years; therefore, be it

6 HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES RESOLVED, ΒY THE OF THE 7 NINETY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we Public 8 encourage the Illinois Department of Health to promulgate administrative rules pursuant to the requirement 9 10 for health examinations and immunizations within the School 11 Code and to encourage higher rates of vaccinations and to expedite this process in order to have such rules in place for 12 the 2015-16 school year; and be it further 13

14 RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be 15 delivered to the Director of the Illinois Department of Public 16 Health.
