2	AMENDMENT NO Amend Senate Bill 565 by replacing
3	everything after the enacting clause with the following:
4	"Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing Section
5	27-8.1 as follows:
6	(105 ILCS 5/27-8.1) (from Ch. 122, par. 27-8.1)
7	Sec. 27-8.1. Health examinations and immunizations.
8	(1) In compliance with rules and regulations which the
9	Department of Public Health shall promulgate, and except as
10	hereinafter provided, all children in Illinois shall have a
11	health examination as follows: within one year prior to
12	entering kindergarten or the first grade of any public,
13	private, or parochial elementary school; upon entering the
14	sixth and ninth grades of any public, private, or parochial
15	school; prior to entrance into any public, private, or
16	parochial nursery school; and, irrespective of grade,

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1 immediately prior to or upon entrance into any public, private, 2 or parochial school or nursery school, each child shall present proof of having been examined in accordance with this Section 3 4 and the rules and regulations promulgated hereunder. Any child 5 who received a health examination within one year prior to 6 entering the fifth grade for the 2007-2008 school year is not required to receive an additional health examination in order 7 to comply with the provisions of Public Act 95-422 when he or 8 9 she attends school for the 2008-2009 school year, unless the 10 child is attending school for the first time as provided in 11 this paragraph.

A tuberculosis skin test screening shall be included as a 12 13 required part of each health examination included under this 14 Section if the child resides in an area designated by the 15 Department of Public Health as having a high incidence of 16 tuberculosis. Additional health examinations of pupils, including eye examinations, may be required when deemed 17 18 necessary by school authorities. Parents are encouraged to have 19 their children undergo eye examinations at the same points in 20 time required for health examinations.

(1.5) In compliance with rules adopted by the Department of Public Health and except as otherwise provided in this Section, all children in kindergarten and the second and sixth grades of any public, private, or parochial school shall have a dental examination. Each of these children shall present proof of having been examined by a dentist in accordance with this 09900SB0565sam001 -3- LRB099 03009 NHT 33381 a

1 Section and rules adopted under this Section before May 15th of 2 the school year. If a child in the second or sixth grade fails to present proof by May 15th, the school may hold the child's 3 4 report card until one of the following occurs: (i) the child 5 presents proof of a completed dental examination or (ii) the 6 child presents proof that a dental examination will take place within 60 days after May 15th. The Department of Public Health 7 8 shall establish, by rule, a waiver for children who show an 9 undue burden or a lack of access to a dentist. Each public, 10 private, and parochial school must give notice of this dental 11 examination requirement to the parents and quardians of students at least 60 days before May 15th of each school year. 12

13 (1.10) Except as otherwise provided in this Section, all 14 children enrolling in kindergarten in a public, private, or 15 parochial school on or after the effective date of this 16 amendatory Act of the 95th General Assembly and any student enrolling for the first time in a public, private, or parochial 17 school on or after the effective date of this amendatory Act of 18 the 95th General Assembly shall have an eve examination. Each 19 20 of these children shall present proof of having been examined 21 by a physician licensed to practice medicine in all of its 22 branches or a licensed optometrist within the previous year, in 23 accordance with this Section and rules adopted under this 24 Section, before October 15th of the school year. If the child 25 fails to present proof by October 15th, the school may hold the 26 child's report card until one of the following occurs: (i) the

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1 child presents proof of a completed eye examination or (ii) the child presents proof that an eye examination will take place 2 within 60 days after October 15th. The Department of Public 3 4 Health shall establish, by rule, a waiver for children who show 5 an undue burden or a lack of access to a physician licensed to practice medicine in all of its branches who provides eye 6 examinations or to a licensed optometrist. Each public, 7 8 private, and parochial school must give notice of this eye 9 examination requirement to the parents and guardians of 10 students in compliance with rules of the Department of Public 11 Health. Nothing in this Section shall be construed to allow a school to exclude a child from attending because of a parent's 12 13 or guardian's failure to obtain an eye examination for the 14 child.

15 (2) The Department of Public Health shall promulgate rules 16 and regulations specifying the examinations and procedures that constitute a health examination, which shall include 17 social and emotional screening and the collection of data 18 19 relating to obesity (including at a minimum, date of birth, 20 gender, height, weight, blood pressure, and date of exam), and 21 a dental examination and may recommend by rule that certain 22 additional examinations be performed. The rules and 23 regulations of the Department of Public Health shall specify 24 that a tuberculosis skin test screening shall be included as a 25 required part of each health examination included under this 26 Section if the child resides in an area designated by the 09900SB0565sam001 -5- LRB099 03009 NHT 33381 a

1 Department of Public Health as having a high incidence of 2 tuberculosis. With respect to social and emotional screening, the rules shall, at a minimum, recommend the use of the Ages 3 4 and Stages Questionnaire and the Pediatric Symptom Checklist, 5 shall provide that social and emotional screeners are not 6 intended to replace or duplicate healthcare systems conducting screening and anticipatory guidance consistent with 7 recommendations of the American Academy of Pediatrics, and must 8 9 be consistent with the State Board of Education's social and 10 emotional learning standards. The Department of Public Health 11 shall specify that a diabetes screening as defined by rule included as a required part of each health 12 shall be 13 examination. Diabetes testing is not required.

Physicians licensed to practice medicine in all of its 14 15 branches, advanced practice nurses who have a written 16 collaborative agreement with a collaborating physician which authorizes them to perform health examinations, or physician 17 assistants who have been delegated the performance of health 18 19 examinations by their supervising physician shall be 20 responsible for the performance of the health examinations, other than dental examinations, eye examinations, and vision 21 22 and hearing screening, and shall sign all report forms required 23 by subsection (4) of this Section that pertain to those 24 portions of the health examination for which the physician, 25 advanced practice nurse, or physician assistant is 26 responsible. If a registered nurse performs any part of a

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1 health examination, then a physician licensed to practice 2 medicine in all of its branches must review and sign all required report forms. Licensed dentists shall perform all 3 4 dental examinations and shall sign all report forms required by 5 subsection (4) of this Section that pertain to the dental 6 examinations. Physicians licensed to practice medicine in all its branches or licensed optometrists shall perform all eye 7 8 examinations required by this Section and shall sign all report 9 forms required by subsection (4) of this Section that pertain 10 to the eye examination. For purposes of this Section, an eye 11 examination shall at a minimum include history, visual acuity, subjective refraction to best visual acuity near and far, 12 13 internal and external examination, and a glaucoma evaluation, 14 as well as any other tests or observations that in the 15 professional judgment of the doctor are necessary. Vision and 16 hearing screening tests, which shall not be considered examinations as that term is used in this Section, shall be 17 conducted in accordance with rules and regulations of the 18 Department of Public Health, and by individuals whom the 19 20 Department of Public Health has certified. In these rules and 21 regulations, the Department of Public Health shall require that 22 individuals conducting vision screening tests give a child's 23 parent or guardian written notification, before the vision 24 screening is conducted, that states, "Vision screening is not a 25 substitute for a complete eye and vision evaluation by an eye 26 doctor. Your child is not required to undergo this vision 1 screening if an optometrist or ophthalmologist has completed 2 and signed a report form indicating that an examination has 3 been administered within the previous 12 months."

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4 (3) Every child shall, at or about the same time as he or 5 she receives a health examination required by subsection (1) of 6 this Section, present to the local school proof of having 7 received such immunizations against preventable communicable 8 diseases as the Department of Public Health shall require by 9 rules and regulations promulgated pursuant to this Section and 10 the Communicable Disease Prevention Act.

11 (4) The individuals conducting the health examination, dental examination, or eye examination shall record the fact of 12 13 having conducted the examination, and such additional 14 information as required, including for a health examination 15 data relating to obesity (including at a minimum, date of 16 birth, gender, height, weight, blood pressure, and date of exam), on uniform forms which the Department of Public Health 17 and the State Board of Education shall prescribe for statewide 18 19 use. The examiner shall summarize on the report form any 20 condition that he or she suspects indicates a need for special 21 services, including for a health examination factors relating social and emotional functioning and 22 obesity. The to 23 individuals confirming the administration of required 24 immunizations shall record as indicated on the form that the 25 immunizations were administered.

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(5) If a child does not submit proof of having had either

1 the health examination or the immunization as required, then the child shall be examined or receive the immunization, as the 2 3 case may be, and present proof by October 15 of the current 4 school year, or by an earlier date of the current school year 5 established by a school district. To establish a date before 6 October 15 of the current school year for the health 7 examination or immunization as required, a school district must 8 give notice of the requirements of this Section 60 days prior 9 to the earlier established date. If for medical reasons one or 10 more of the required immunizations must be given after October 11 15 of the current school year, or after an earlier established date of the current school year, then the child shall present, 12 13 by October 15, or by the earlier established date, a schedule 14 for the administration of the immunizations and a statement of 15 the medical reasons causing the delay, both the schedule and 16 the statement being issued by the physician, advanced practice nurse, physician assistant, registered nurse, or local health 17 18 department that will be responsible for administration of the remaining required immunizations. If a child does not comply by 19 20 October 15, or by the earlier established date of the current 21 school year, with the requirements of this subsection, then the 22 local school authority shall exclude that child from school 23 until such time as the child presents proof of having had the 24 health examination as required and presents proof of having 25 received those required immunizations which are medically 26 possible to receive immediately. 1 from school for noncompliance with this subsection, the child's parents or legal guardian shall be considered in violation of 2 Section 26-1 and subject to any penalty imposed by Section 3 4 26-10. This subsection (5) does not apply to dental 5 examinations and eye examinations. If the student is an 6 out-of-state transfer student and does not have the proof required under this subsection (5) before October 15 of the 7 8 current year or whatever date is set by the school district, 9 then he or she may only attend classes (i) if he or she has 10 proof that an appointment for the required vaccinations has 11 been scheduled with a party authorized to submit proof of the required vaccinations. If the proof of vaccination required 12 13 under this subsection (5) is not submitted within 30 days after 14 the student is permitted to attend classes, then the student is 15 not to be permitted to attend classes until proof of the 16 vaccinations has been properly submitted. No school district or employee of a school district shall be held liable for any 17 injury or illness to another person that results from admitting 18 19 out-of-state transfer student to class that has an an 20 appointment scheduled pursuant to this subsection (5).

(6) Every school shall report to the State Board of Education by November 15, in the manner which that agency shall require, the number of children who have received the necessary immunizations and the health examination (other than a dental examination or eye examination) as required, indicating, of those who have not received the immunizations and examination 09900SB0565sam001 -10- LRB099 03009 NHT 33381 a

1 as required, the number of children who are exempt from health examination and immunization requirements on religious or 2 medical grounds as provided in subsection (8). On or before 3 December 1 of each year, every public school district and 4 5 registered nonpublic school shall make publicly available the 6 immunization data they are required to submit to the State Board of Education by November 15. The immunization data made 7 publicly available must be identical to the data the school 8 9 district or school has reported to the State Board of 10 Education.

11 Every school shall report to the State Board of Education by June 30, in the manner that the State Board requires, the 12 number of children who have received the required dental 13 examination, indicating, of those who have not received the 14 15 required dental examination, the number of children who are 16 exempt from the dental examination on religious grounds as provided in subsection (8) of this Section and the number of 17 18 children who have received a waiver under subsection (1.5) of 19 this Section.

Every school shall report to the State Board of Education by June 30, in the manner that the State Board requires, the number of children who have received the required eye examination, indicating, of those who have not received the required eye examination, the number of children who are exempt from the eye examination as provided in subsection (8) of this Section, the number of children who have received a waiver 09900SB0565sam001 -11- LRB099 03009 NHT 33381 a

1 under subsection (1.10) of this Section, and the total number 2 of children in noncompliance with the eye examination 3 requirement.

4 The reported information under this subsection (6) shall be 5 provided to the Department of Public Health by the State Board 6 of Education.

(7) Upon determining that the number of pupils who are 7 8 required to be in compliance with subsection (5) of this 9 Section is below 90% of the number of pupils enrolled in the 10 school district, 10% of each State aid payment made pursuant to 11 Section 18-8.05 to the school district for such year may be withheld by the State Board of Education until the number of 12 13 students in compliance with subsection (5) is the applicable 14 specified percentage or higher.

15 (8) Parents or legal quardians who object to health, 16 dental, or eye examinations or any part thereof, or to immunizations, on religious grounds shall not be required to 17 18 submit their children or wards to the examinations or 19 immunizations to which they so object if such parents or legal 20 guardians present to the appropriate local school authority a signed statement of objection, detailing the grounds for the 21 22 objection. If the physical condition of the child is such that 23 any one or more of the immunizing agents should not be 24 administered, the examining physician, advanced practice 25 nurse, or physician assistant responsible for the performance 26 of the health examination shall endorse that fact upon the 09900SB0565sam001 -12- LRB099 03009 NHT 33381 a

health examination form. Exempting a child from the health, dental, or eye examination does not exempt the child from participation in the program of physical education training provided in Sections 27-5 through 27-7 of this Code.

5 (9) For the purposes of this Section, "nursery schools" 6 means those nursery schools operated by elementary school 7 systems or secondary level school units or institutions of 8 higher learning.
