

99TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2015 and 2016 SB0677

Introduced 2/3/2015, by Sen. Antonio Muñoz

SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

220 ILCS 5/5-117

Amends the Public Utilities Act. Requires all local exchange telecommunications carriers with at least 35,000 subscriber access lines and a person or entity providing cable or video service to submit an annual report concerning procurement goals and actual spending for female-owned, minority-owned, veteran-owned, and small business enterprises. Effective immediately.

FISCAL NOTE ACT MAY APPLY

1 AN ACT concerning regulation.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- 4 Section 5. The Public Utilities Act is amended by changing
- 5 Section 5-117 as follows:
- 6 (220 ILCS 5/5-117)
- 7 Sec. 5-117. Supplier diversity goals.
- 8 (a) The public policy of this State is to collaboratively 9 work with companies that serve Illinois residents to improve
- 10 their supplier diversity in a non-antagonistic manner.
- 11 (b) The Commission shall require all gas, electric, and
- 12 water companies with at least 100,000 customers under its
- authority; all local exchange telecommunications carriers with
- 14 <u>at least 35,000 subscriber access lines; and a person or entity</u>
- providing cable service or video service, as defined in Section
- 16 <u>21-201 of this Act,</u> to submit an annual report by April 15,
- 17 2015 and every April 15 thereafter, in a searchable Adobe PDF
- 18 format, on all procurement goals and actual spending for
- 19 female-owned, minority-owned, veteran-owned, and small
- 20 business enterprises in the previous calendar year. These goals
- 21 shall be expressed as a percentage of the total work performed
- 22 by the entity submitting the report, and the actual spending
- for all female-owned, minority-owned, veteran-owned, and small

- business enterprises shall also be expressed as a percentage of the total work performed by the entity submitting the report.
 - (c) Each participating company in its annual report shall include the following information:
 - (1) an explanation of the plan for the next year to increase participation;
 - (2) an explanation of the plan to increase the goals;
 - (3) the areas of procurement each company shall be actively seeking more participation in in the next year;
 - (4) an outline of the plan to alert and encourage potential vendors in that area to seek business from the company;
 - (5) an explanation of the challenges faced in finding quality vendors and offer any suggestions for what the Commission could do to be helpful to identify those vendors;
 - (6) a list of the certifications the company recognizes;
 - (7) the point of contact for any potential vendor who wishes to do business with the company and explain the process for a vendor to enroll with the company as a minority-owned, women-owned, or veteran-owned company; and
 - (8) any particular success stories to encourage other companies to emulate best practices.
 - (d) Each annual report shall include as much State-specific data as possible. If the submitting entity does not submit

- 1 State-specific data, then the company shall include any
- 2 national data it does have and explain why it could not submit
- 3 State-specific data and how it intends to do so in future
- 4 reports, if possible.
- 5 (e) Each annual report shall include the rules,
- 6 regulations, and definitions used for the procurement goals in
- 7 the company's annual report.
- 8 (f) The Commission and all participating entities shall
- 9 hold an annual workshop open to the public in 2015 and every
- 10 year thereafter on the state of supplier diversity to
- 11 collaboratively seek solutions to structural impediments to
- 12 achieving stated goals, including testimony from each
- 13 participating entity as well as subject matter experts and
- 14 advocates. The Commission shall publish a database on its
- website of the point of contact for each participating entity
- 16 for supplier diversity, along with a list of certifications
- each company recognizes from the information submitted in each
- 18 annual report. The Commission shall publish each annual report
- 19 on its website and shall maintain each annual report for at
- 20 least 5 years.
